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


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Office News



Welcome to the NEW and improved Webpage – we have had some great feedback from you all out there! Still to come will be online services, such as Membership Renewal, Marketplace and Stallion Barn. I advise you to keep a regular check on the page for updated news items, as this is the first place we will advise youto go. Just in case you are looking for a good bit of night time reading I suggest you make sure you are aware of all the Rules and Regulations.



The new rule for compulsory DNA on registration for fillies had overall had a positive response from members and for those who find it an unnecessary burden, we ask you to look at it as positive manner in which the Paint Horse Association can promote its breed and ensure that the horse has the parentage you believe you bought or bred. In the 12 months that I have been here,

there has been six cases of parent anomalies. By DNA profiling our fillies at rego, we will also substantially smooth the path when it comes to breeding these girls down the track because it's all done!

In relation to the time frames for the return of DNA Profiling and Genetic Testing, these are outside our control unfortunately. It is apparent it is now taking up to four weeks for results to come back to us from the time the samples are received at Racing NSW. Plan ahead is the best advice we can give, if you need results do them as early as possible. It is compulsory for all DNA Sampling for Parent Validation to come through us (through Racing Australia).

A thank you to those Sponsors who have already come on board to support our 2017 National Show and Youth Auction. The Sponsorship dollar is hard to come by these day, major companies already support MAJOR worthwhile causes and do not see a Breed Association as a high priority. We are reliant on many small local business and members supporting us as are local clubs and State Shows. Remember we are always on the lookout for a business you know might like to sponsor, so pop the question to your local shop owner. The cheapest sponsorship at \$55 allows us to purchase Premium Rosettes and Ribbons (as requested by competitors) and cover some prize costs on a class.

TAKING A QUALITY SAMPLE OF HAIR FOR GENETIC TESTING

The most important aspect of a sample of hair is the presence of follicles (root bulbs) on the end of the hair sample that has been pulled from the horses' neck. Sample size must be more than 10 hairs.

It is important you have clean hands and have no other horse hair present when you collect your sample.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Pull (DO NOT CUT) 20-30 tail or mane hairs by wrapping hairs around forefinger. For foals, use tail hairs only.
- Grasp hair close to the animal's body to ensure roots are included. Pull straight toward your body.
- Visually check that roots are attached to hair. DO NOT TOUCH ROOT BULBS.
- Immediately tape hair and preferably place in a CLEAN snap lock bag to ensure no cross contamination prior to fastening on test request paperwork and posting off.
- Hair sample must be dry, wet samples will deteriorate the follicles prior to testing.


As an organisation I would like to think the PHAA promotes respect and harmony to all members, regardless of their faith. I ask



Western or English -I enjoy both events enormously although Western is my favourite.



I have had a long standing love for Paint Horses, often admiring them in movies and the show ring, but there were never many around when I was in the market for a horse. I have owned a few solid colour Quarter Horses over the years, which have all had lovely 'can do' and friendly attitudes, but I was looking for something with a bit more colour and Pizzazz. I was also really interested in getting into Reining, so I got in contact with Graham Cooper who suggested checking out Shaws Performance Horses. I couldn't believe my luck that there was a breeder who not only bred Paint Horses, but specialised in Reining as well.

The next thing I knew I was in the car with a six month old baby and a two year old driving to Rod and Gail's property. I checked out many of their horses including the breeding stock (in between breast feeding the baby) and eventually I agreed to purchase Special. Her athletic build, black and white colouring, her striking blue eyes and quiet nature along with some excellent breeding won me over. After agreeing to the purchase Gail said, "you realise she's deaf". I had no idea, but Gail assured me that it wouldn't be a problem at all and she was right. We all still find ourselves talking to her anyway whilst handling and riding but she really reacts extremely well to body language.



Special was very friendly and accepting from the start and I never had any issues handling her. She was great to wash, float and lead around. With her blue eyes and white face I needed to cover her up all the time so she didn't suffer from sunburn. I couldn't wait to

ride her, but had to wait around a year so made do with leading her up and down my street. When she was old enough I sent her to Graham Cooper to be trained. He was pretty happy with how she progressed through being broken in and then taking on some Reining training so he suggested entering Special in the Reining Australia Gold Buckle Futurity.

A specialist horse photographer, Stephen Mowbray took a liking to Special at several Reining competitions for her striking looks in the performance ring and took some lovely photographs of her. One of these photographs appeared in the May 2015 Australian Horseman Magazine.

Due to my family commitments I leased Special out to Shannon Caldwell from 2/12/2015. Shannon went on to win the 14 to 18 yr Youth at the NSW Championships. Shannon won her first ever buckle at her first major show with Special Guns.

Special is still training with Graham Cooper and will be shown in Open Derby and Youth Events in the near future.

The fact that Special is deaf and has gone on to win many competitions just shows that deafness really has no impact on a performance horse.

List of Achievements

Special Guns is a 5 year old mare trained by Graham Cooper of Coopers Performance Horses With Graham as a 3 yr old she achieved: Winner of the VRHA Open Futurity, Winner of the Slide to the National Open Futurity, Placed 3rd at the NSW Championships open Futurity and Placed 8th at the Reining Australia National Futurity.

She has now returned to us to continue her show career and will be shown by Graham in the Open Derbies and Youth Events with our daughter Elle.

ON THE BACK OF A PAINT HORSE

I have literally emerged from "hell on earth" on the back of a Paint Horse, well two actually and one led girl.

My life to date has been a continual struggle, with depression and other little set backs like divorce and Breast Cancer, but the biggest challenge has always been depression for me, now labelled PTSD. In simple terms a major lack of selfworth. I have now hit an equilibrium if you like with the help of psychologists and heaps of reading and the realisation that we attract all that is in our lives, both good and bad.

We are what we believe, not what we think but what we believe. It is what is deep down that brings in what is in our lives. There is a huge difference. I believed I was worthless, unlovable – need I say what I attracted. Life would give me good, but I didn't believe I was deserving, so much of it was tainted. You were so successful with your horses, you might say, well of course, I always believed I was good with horses right from an early age. Never good

enough but good. More image problems I'm facing, this process is on going.

Let's turn the clock back just a little, and I'll set a little background. I have always turned to my horses for solitude when my world was out of sorts, which was nearly all the time from the time I was young. I had shown to top level with Quarter Horses for many years, running from my deep seated self loathing, it was easier to hide than face at that stage. When I got divorced in 2008/09 I started a journey to face those buried demons. During this time I questioned my ability with horses, everything else I believed wasn't correct so how could that be. Heck I even believed I was fat at 175cm and 74kg, so I gave up showing. In 2011 got into a relationship for the wrong reasons, but there was some good that came out of it. He scoffed at my journey of self healing, but



he did encourage me eventually to go back out with my horses. My old reliable mate, Quarter Horse stallion Tomcatin Around, was no longer sound, so I turned to his coloured daughter Rosies Magic Alaround.

My first year of showing consisted of seven AG shows and the 2013 Qld State Show. I had set the goal of getting Magic's Superior All Round award - she was so close we just needed to tidy up a Superior and get another ROM in a different category and yes we got it. I always set goals at the start of the showing year, normally of the award variety, not High Point, it is how I function I need goal posts if you like, and I don't like shifting them. The State Show that year was almost enough to end my showing completely though, my anxieties were working all systems go and I had a shocker. When I got High Point Senior Horse for the 2012-13 year, with so few shows the fire was sparked what could I do if I tried. The change of focus helped me get back into the show pen, even though the goal wasn't one of my normal. High Points are too hard as a goal you can only do for yourself you can't control what other people strive to do. I class High Points as bonuses normally. What can I say, we did pretty well, we got High Point Senior Horse again, my goal, Overall Performance Horse, Halter Mare and both Jessie and I were in the Top Ten for Amateurs. I had only got my Amateur ticket in May 2014 to give me extra classes at AG shows, more classes more prize money, simple really.

At 5am on June 23 2014 my world turned upside down, and if you are wondering I still get upset when I think about that morning and the day that unfolded. I found a lump in my beast, I was in disbelief it couldn't be Cancer I had only just had a Mammogram with Breast Screen Qld. I had the letter telling me it was all clear. For the double whammy, I was struggling with my depression at the time and that same day I found myself in"involuntary detention" with Mental Health Queensland, all my rights were taken from me I was informed if I tried to leave I would be arrested and returned. I was locked up because the case worker refused to listen, and I was in a fragile state. The scares this has left me with are actually deeper than the ones from five breast cancer operations and taking even longer to heal. What a day.

Once released from the Mental Health Unit I had the lump examined. At first it was believed it couldn't be cancerous because cancers don't move and mine was very mobile. A week passed in denial, but my worse fears were confirmed. Sitting in the doctor's being told I went numb, for a lady with major selfworth issues it was a duel whammy. I was not only facing the threat of dying, which everyone else was worried about, but for me was actually the easy one, but of being totally unlovable if I survived.



Who would find a breastless woman attractive enough to love? All the advertising you see correlates breasts with attractiveness and desirability after all, remembering I was dealing with major selfworth issues; I didn't even like looking at photos of my horses with me in them. Bit hard since I was the one showing them.

What to do. My first challenge was an easy one, my first operation was scheduled for August 4 2014 after the close of the 2014 show year. I showed the last month of the 2013-14 year out. I had worked so hard to date and I was pretty sure I was doing okay, plus it gave me somewhere to hide. I was tired, I was scared, I was confused, but once again my horses filled the gap and helped me through.

For those unfamiliar with Cancer treatment, let me shed some light if I may. It is a game of percentages and margins, there is no guarantee with any of it, only a system of figures and past procedures that have proved successful. Cancer can hit anyone at anytime. All they can do is improve the odds, bring you back to equal. With those who have never had it, they can't tell you it won't come back, and they can't tell you why it came in the first place. Your mental strength is the only real cure. If you allow it to defeat you it will, bit like a stubborn horse.

My first operation although removing the obvious lump and lymph nodes revealed much more, I had corrupted cells DCIS that were only visible in pathology, back for a second try to get those elusive margins. I was fighting to keep my sanity, I was fighting to be loveable, I was fighting to keep my breast. When the second operation failed they wanted me to have a mastectomy, but it would be between 3-5 years in the public system before a reconstruction would be offered. I couldn't do it so they tried again, but they still couldn't get the margins, the clearance from the corrupted cells. As I said Cancer treatment is a game of percentages of margins of clear cells, but time had run out for now and I had to proceed to the next part of treatment chemotherapy and radiation.

At around about this time, actually the weekend before my first chemo treatment and 28 days after my third operation, Sarah Peters had borrowed Magic for a Youth Camp at Burpengary and they were having a show at the completion of the camp. Her mum Chris suggested that she could get the kids to clean Magic up and I could show her if I was up to it. I went down and I did show her – the stage was set. The committee of the Burpengary Western Performance Club even presented me with a floral rosette for one of the classes I won, I took that rosette with me to every Chemo treatment and every operation to help give me strength when mine was waiving. I still have it in prime position.





Chemo took it's toll, the government has this crazy idea that they would withhold an injection on the first course to see if you do actually go neutropenic. It is a crazy place where you have no ability to even fight off the slightest of infections. As well as red and white blood cells we have these things called neutrophils that ward off infection, chemo can kill those cells as well as the cancerous ones. Well as things were going for me I did, I went neutropenic. Jessie had wanted to do a show on the southside of Brisbane about the time when my system if it was going to be hit would be, and she wasn't sure on how to get there so she asked my then partner if he would drive her. He suggested taking a larger float so I could also take Magic. If I got to show her I did, if I wasn't up to it, there was no harm done. One of the good things he did for me. I did show her, only in led events, when I nearly collapsed after doing the Hunter In Hand I decided I shouldn't attempt to ride. I was feeling so weak I couldn't get warm, my temps were fine. I was just so tired. I didn't know that things were going wrong. I ended up in hospital the Thursday after being pumped with antibiotics and I don't know what else I just know I felt like a pin cushion. My partner of the time, didn't like hospitals so most of the five days I spent there were alone. I spent another stay in hospital with my third treatment once again alone. In between I had my horse, I was determined and that was what kept me going. I shifted my focus. I had set my goals.

My first goal I declared at the show that weekend I was getting very sick was, I was going to show in Masters, this was October. I was 49, I turned 50 in May. To show Masters I had to make 50. I then set a fill in goal of getting my PHAA Amateur Champion Award. I had only just started showing Amateur again, so that seemed reasonable. I didn't set a time frame just the goal because I had no idea how much I was capable of doing throughout my treatment. As things progressed to keep my determination strong I also added showing at the PHAA Nationals. I had done heaps of Quarter Horse Nationals but never a PHAA one.

I would like to at this time give a huge thankyou to the committees organising shows for allowing me to play each day by ear and do what I could, even though I couldn't tell them in advance. I would let them know I was wanting to come, nominate for the first couple of events and sort the rest after. I never let them down and they didn't let me down. Thank you guys for helping and for trusting in me.

I was waging a war with Cancer and self image in a relationship that wasn't the most supportive. Just how unsupportive I was to find out later, and true to form I turned to my horses.

My chemo ran from 21 September 2014 to 15 November 2014 and they had to modify things to allow for my PTSD. The pre chemo drugs were known for lowering your mood, they didn't want to test just how low mine could go. I was sent for an appointment with the radiation oncologist early in September, because I still had my breast and you have to also have radiation treatments as well as chemo. During my appointment the oncologist once again brought up the issue of the low margin. It turned out that I hadn't heard properly and I had less than I thought. I was sitting comfortable with the idea that I had 4mm when I actually only had 0.4mm. Bit of a shock, however the offer, because of my PTSD that I could be put under the head plastic surgeon and have a procedure whereby a bladder could be inserted under the chest wall at the time of the mastectomy. This expanded the chest to allow for a silicon implant to be inserted for a "breast mound". Too much to take in at the time, everything happened so quickly.

It was during my second round of chemo, when I was sitting there alone crying with nurses trying to locate a vein to put the cannula into. They couldn't use my right arm, as I have no lymph nodes in it. I lost them first operation and the left arm veins had collapsed because of the first lot of chemo, that I decided that I wasn't doing this again and arrangements were made for me to loose my breast. I couldn't go through another lot of chemo, if because due to low margins it came back again. I didn't realise mentally just how much more of a fight I was in for though at the time, I just know I couldn't do chemo again.

The fight against Cancer had actually started, I was now determined to beat Cancer, prior to that I was just going through the motions, I really didn't care. I was scared, I had given up.

My mind was telling me I was worthless, unlovable what did it matter anyway and the partner I was with was more concerned about how he was feeling, not that his reaction would have mattered anyway, the "inner demons" were talking and taking over. The law of attraction had run it's course again. I believed I wasn't worth looking after, that all my relationships fall to bits when I get sick. That was exactly what I got.

I put my energy into showing and into avoiding the negative thoughts that would emerge anytime I would have to sit for too long. I would keep myself busy, as each show would finish I would find another to go to. Idle time meant thinking time, thinking time meant "demon" time.

I had my 4th operation December 19 2014, my beast was gone and in its place was what, scars. I showed Magic at Dalby in January 2015. Sarah Peters was there with me, helping with the things like saddling that I couldn't do. Between her and Jessie, Magic was kept ready for me to ride whilst my scars from this operation were healing. Once again the committees were very helpful, bending rules just slightly for me. I had people say just how strong I was. Little did they know I as running scared from what was inside that was even more deadly. Next was the expansion of the chest wall. It was a bit strange having your breast size converted into ml of fluid, but mine are 450ml. They were running short on time so instead of a month between 100ml fluid inputs I was condensed to fortnightly. Each time the bladder would get firmer and firmer restricting the movement of my right arm for riding. I couldn't stop riding, the other alternative was deadly, so I learned to ride left handed, not as pretty but it worked for six months.

My radiation started on 12 February 2015, I was determined to push for my goal of showing at the PHAA Nationals in April. It was going to be tight and there was no way of knowing how much damage the radiation would cause to my chest wall, so I was super diligent. I couldn't lose sight of my goal, it was my focus the thing that kept me pushing through. It would have been so easy at any stage to just give up and let the "demons" take over but my horses kept me going. My radiation finished on April 1 and showing started in about two weeks. After that, I was tired, I was sore, but the support I received from the PHAA, the show team and most of the competitors still holds me in awe. I never realised the support that is out there. Helen Bentley from Embroidery FX gave me a shirt that became my martyr, "I'm tougher than Cancer". Together it was what was needed to keep me going that last little bit of the Cancer journey.

The bulk of the treatment was complete, and with that came the tablets. Well true to form my body didn't like them either. My PTSD dictated what meds could be tried to start with, they conveniently froze my joints up, I was in pain all the time, even

getting to standing position after sitting for any length of time was an issue. I'm now on no meds because the risk of a blood clot for me on the other ones was too great, I know "I'm tougher than Cancer" so it doesn't worry me not taking the precautionary medication. Due to the pain I had to cut down the number of classes I did, but I was determined to have my goal and compete in Masters, so at the Queensland State Show 2015 I made the choice to go out of Amateur into Masters, with the hope that I had achieved my Amateur Champion Award. A computer system upgrade means I still don't know, but I figured I had given it my best shot. I had another goal to achieve I was in pain and didn't know what was around the corner. I did it with style taking out the High Point Masters of the show, my highlight being winning the Masters Showmanship. Sarah Peters was sharing Magic through this year and had just taken out the Senior Youth Showmanship Championship. I was happy but my partner wasn't there to share in it, this was the start of the next hiccup.

I had made the decision that because of my way of coping with the Cancer treatment, being immersing myself in my "comfort place" of showing my horses, I would give back to my partner in the form of easing back showing in the upcoming year, after all I had shown every weekend. Anything to stop thinking about what was happening to my body. That was just too, too scary, remembering my other major problem. The fact that I equated being loveable to being attractive, and being attractive in my mind meant having an alright body, which mine was now totally non existent. You had to have breasts to be even remotely attractive as a woman, my mind's way of thinking remember, not the reasonable way of thinking.

I put Magic in foal, I set the goal for the year at a very reasonable Yearling Certificate of Excellent for my now yearling Daytona Cher. That was just three ROMs after all since she already had the halter one. Easily done, actually points were achieved by October 2015 right at the time that my then partner decided that being with me wasn't fun anymore, and to make matters worse decided that I needed a mind readjustment to boot. He felt the need to put into words my gravest fears, that having Cancer and the scars it had left my body with did in fact make me unlovable, totally worthless. He did this gradually and his reasoning he proudly declared was he wanted it to still be in my head in 12 months time. There very nearly wasn't a head to be in, the demons I had been running from were here growling and





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pulling me into the deepest darkest of holes, if it wasn't for a promise that I made my beautiful daughter they would have got me too. Welcome my third savour. Stringers CK Sonofacowboy.

Jessie had convinced me to go to a show at Dalby, I hadn't been riding, I just couldn't. I had been playing with Cher, but that was minimal, but I was chasing in an off hand type of way, Magic's Silver Century in Halter. Back to my goals again, but couldn't really get into them. I had done what I had set out for the year by October and I couldn't really look at doing anything with Magic. She was in foal. Who knew how long she could show so why bother. Without goals or motivation I was at an all time low. I'm not really sure how I decided to actually get on and ride/show Magic, but the buzz I got was the best. I actually felt a little alive. I needed a horse to ride/show that was obvious, one that I could get immersed in achieving goals with. Law of Attraction came into play.

You know the thing that attracts, that book you need, that parking spot, the helping hand. My helping hand came in the form of a very generous offer from Amanda Park with conditions. A lease on a horse, with the proviso that I go to the Nationals with him as it was her daughter's goal. It was end of February 2016 and I had no idea how, but I knew I had to, so my focus was shifted from the "demons" that were pulling me down into the deepest of holes to getting this horse going to National standard. Amanda did give me an out, but I couldn't afford to take it. Those demons were still growling, the goal was set and I had to rise to the challenge and to do that I had to put those "demons" back in there cages. We contained them long enough for me to regain some strength and start retraining my mind.

As they say the proof is in the pudding. Sonny and I made National Reserve Champion Masters Hunter Under Saddle, and we even placed 6th in the Amateur Hunter Under Saddle Jackpot, not quite an hour after running the Barrels. We got a 3rd in the Masters

Dressage, his first ever, and he helped me fulfil another dream of placing in the Nev Anning Trail, we got Reserve Champion actually.

My lease on Sonny was until July 31 2017 but I decided that it was time I took these demons on, so I returned him after the Queensland State Show in July 2016. We had a spectacular show, a fitting way to see out a winning, in all ways, partnership. High Point Masters. Runner up High Point 4 & 5yr, Championships in Masters English Equitation, English Pleasure, Masters Western Horsemanship, Junior Reining, Masters Bareback Equitation, Reserves in 4 & 5 Hunter Under Saddle, Masters Hunter Under Saddle, Masters Dressage, Sue Maxwell Feature, Masters Western Equitation. We clocked up over 180 points for the five months and he saved my life to boot.

I still have Daytona Cher but have decided to leave breaking her in until about April 2017 or so to give me time to do some other retraining, with my mind this time. I have decided it is time for Rosies Magic Alaround to help shape and perhaps even save someone else's life so she is on the market. She gave me a super cute solid colt, who is also for sale. I have my Tomcatin Around granddaughter in the form a coloured filly by Justa Cowboy, RJF Cute Cowgirl (pending) and together with Cher will be my team if and when I show.

People are quick to criticise winners particular when you have taken out as much as I have, but very rarely do they stop to think about the story behind it. I have learned we have two choices in life fight or go under. Mental determination can get you what you want, brute force can't. The forces that pull against us fade into non existence when we believe in our worth. I now look at myself in the mirror every morning and declare my love for the person looking back at me. Some mornings she believes it some she doesn't, but I will continue to work at convincing her, life after all is all about her, we look after the things we love.




Future Development

Bred by Jodie and Gail Ward from Daytona Stud, sired by Affirmative out of Jo's Lazy Babe, Cher originally was bought in March 2015 to accompany Rosies Magic Alaround to Ag Shows for the extra prize money. She soon charmed her way into pride of place.

The very well put together filly has been left to mature pretty much naturally, which is what I prefer. She will have a huge under saddle career as time progresses. She is consistent in her Halter placing, but I'm never disheartened if she goes down to a more mature individual. As a weanling she achieved the Honour Roll for the Weanling Filly, which was a pleasant surprise.

This year, after a tedious last year with my cancer journey, had been planned as a quiet year, but as life would have it, it turned out to be pretty much full on after a bad bout with PTSD horses are my saviour. Cher didn't attend all shows that I did, but she was there at most.



My habit has always been to set goals with my horses, something to keep me going each year. This year because it was going to be a quiet one, I had lined up the Yearling Certificate Of Excellence for Cher. She actually ammassed the points for this by October last year. Yep, ROM Halter (she did that as a weanling), 10 points each in HIH, Led Trail and Lungeline from August to October bearing in mind I was being operated on in August. What makes this even more amazing is this was my first attempt at Led Performance. I was known as the HIH Queen, but with Rosies Magic Alaround it was easy, I had never done Led Trail and Lungeline. Daughter Jess gave me some pointers and I winged it most of the time, thankfully Cher was a bit of a natural.

Cher didn't get to go to the Nationals, as everything was against her. My health wasn't in the right place, costs were prohibitive and frankly I didn't think either of us were ready.

In the lead up to Qld State Show, when I still didn't think we were ready, my beautiful daughter Jess Fyfe-Farrell once again took things in hand and took over the critiquing of Cher and more of her ability was encouraged to emerge, with the end result being Qld Sstate Champion Yearling Versatility, Qld Champion Yearling Lunge Line, Qld Champion Led Trail, Qld Reserve Champion Yearling Hunter In Hand and Qld Reserve Champion Masters Showmanship.

Cher ended the year with

Halter 44.5, Am Halter 24.5, Hunter In Hand 50, Lungeline 35, Led Trail 34.5, Led Hack 7.5, Masters Showmanship 10. Cher amassed an amazing 127 performance points, shame she wasn't able to contest the Overall Performance Horse.




