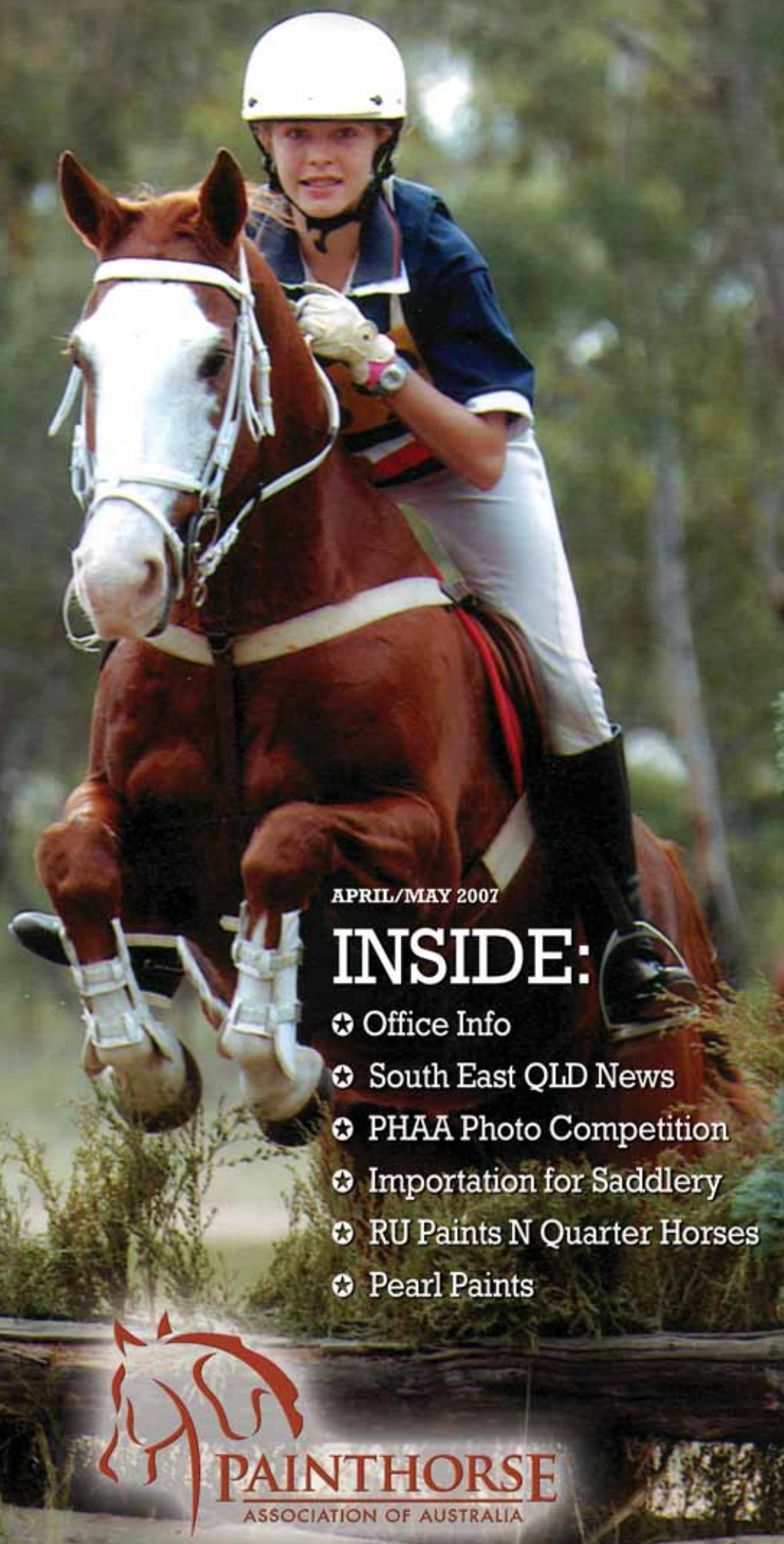

It is a shame that we lost Donna as an employee and we wish her all the best with her future. No doubt in the near future you will be introduced to a new staff member who will take on Donna's job.

This magazine will be out around the same time as the National Show. We wish everyone a safe trip to and from the show and hope that your stay at the show is not only successful in competition but also a whole lot of fun.

The February Board of Directors meeting was particularly productive with some procedure changes, rule changes and some exciting ideas coming out of the meeting. Our directors have been very busy as well.

● CERTIFICATES OF REGISTRATION

We will now be issuing Registration Certificates with the photograph scanned onto the document – no more cut and paste with scissors and glue. On the reverse of the certificate you will see a transfer form. This will enable sellers to complete the transfer on the actual certificate of registration and minimise your paperwork. New owners will have the option of sending an updated photograph as we will issue a fresh certificate on each transfer.

● MEMORANDUM AND ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Commonly known as "The Constitution". We have recently conducted a review of our Constitution and have some "house-keeping" issues to be decided at our Annual General Meeting. Shortly after this we will be reprinting the Constitution and also updating the version on our website.

● PORTFOLIO GUIDELINES AND BY-LAWS

We have produced a document that contains the Portfolio Guidelines, this may interest any member who is considering becoming a director. We have also compiled a booklet of By-Law changes made over the years. By-laws are issues that have been passed in meetings, that aren't strictly a change to our Rule Book or to our Constitution, an example would be the annual donation to the Rural Industries Research & Development Corporation. Both of these documents are available on the website or from the office on request.

● NATIONAL SHOW QUALIFICATION

The Board have discussed the possibility of introducing "qualifiers" for our National Show, this is only at the discussion stage at the moment and the Board would welcome your thoughts on this proposal. The idea is to increase participation at Regional Club level and promote Paint Horses outside of the National Show. The Proposal is – To be eligible to compete at the PHAA National Show the entrant / horse must have competed at a minimum of 2 Shows in the 12 months prior to the National Show.

Exemptions will apply for weanling halter, 2 Year Old Ridden and persons residing further than 300 klms from a Regional Club. The Board will consider further exemptions on a case by case basis, taking into consideration injury, illness and number of events held within the required area. As you can see, it is not "water tight" and there are exemptions, it may help to get more Paint horses out in the public eye and promote awareness of our Beautiful horses.

● SCHOOLS, COLLEGES, UNIVERSITIES ETC

To encourage participation of students of Educational Facilities at Paint Horse Shows, the Board have introduced some exemptions that will allow students to show college owned or leased horses. The college will be required to be a PHAA member, however the "nominees" may alter from show to show, to allow different students to participate. There is also an ownership exemption to allow adult students to compete in Amateur classes with college owned horses – provided they meet all other Amateur requirements. There are rulings as to notification to PHAA of the changes of students. You can read the Rules in the Rule Changes section of this magazine. If you know of any students that attend a school that have Paint Horses please let them know about this rule, we can then encourage more students to enjoy the Paint Horses.

Raffle tickets for the beautiful weanling filly are selling fast. Remember to send a stamped, self addressed envelope with your cheque, money order or credit card. Those who do not submit a stamped return envelope or request tickets over the phone will be charged for postage.

● BREEDING RETURNS

Stallion owners please don't forget that Breeding Returns for the 2006 season are due to be lodged with the PHAA Office. In order to avoid late penalties make sure you have mailed by June 30th. The form can be downloaded from our website or we can mail you a copy, please call if you need a return mailed to you.

● ANNUAL GRAFTON PAINT-O-RAMA - YOUTH & AMATEUR CAMP

Elsewhere in this issue you will find notices about the Paint-o-rama and Camps. I have attended in 2005 and 2006 and it is a ton of fun. Consider coming along, you can learn a lot at the camps and then you get to put it into practice over 3 days under 7 judges!

● 2008 FUTURITIES - NOMINATIONS

Nominations for the 2008 National Futurities will be included in the next Paint Horse Journal, they will also be available to download from our website.

● YOUTH INCENTIVE SIRES CLASSIC

Interested in nominating your stallion to this prestigious event? More information is further along in this journal or you can contact the PHAA Office or President Craig Dengate. There are a lot of weanlings from 2006 that will be eligible for the 2008 Yearling event, check your foals registration certificate, there will be a "YISC Eligible" stamp on the front if your foal is by a nominated sire.

● IMMEDIATE RULE CHANGES - Effective 04.02.07

Rule 3 - Insert to end of Rule 3 - Colleges or Universities may hold a Constituent membership. Students of the college / university may show as nominees within the membership, provided no more than two students exhibit in any one show and the names of the exhibiting students are advised to the PHAA in writing prior to commencement of the show. Evidence that the student is enrolled in the college / university must be provided to the PHAA. Refer also rule 237 (i) (i).

Rule 204 (b) Amend Rule 204 (b) to read – Show results of approved State Shows and the National Show will be published in the Paint Horse Journal. A period of sixty (60) days from the date of publication will be allowed for a correction of printed show results. After that date, no request for show result corrections will be considered.

Rule 237. Insert new rule 237 (d) "The Board of Directors has the authority to deny the acceptance or the continuance of a members amateur status if it believes that the applicant does not qualify under terms of rule 237 (i)". Current (d) becomes (e) and so on.

Rule 237 - Insert new Rule 237 (i) (i) College or University owned horses. Students that are eligible to compete as Amateur or Novice Amateur can show a College or University owned horse or horse that is on loan to the college or university in Amateur or Novice Amateur competition provided the eligibility requirements of rule 237 (i) are met by the individual student. If the horse is not owned by the college / university, written evidence must be provided to the PHAA stating that the horse is on loan for this purpose.

● **PROPOSED RULE CHANGES**
(to become effective 01.08.07)

Please feel free to forward your comments on the following proposed rule changes to the Board of Directors, PHAA, P.O. Box 1008, Dubbo NSW 2830.

Rule 218 Add new paragraph to end – Note – Polo and Polocrosse – Points will be awarded as follows – Horse in winning team – 3 points. Horse in runner-up team – provided three or more teams compete – 2 points.

Insert new rule 219B -In order to be eligible for a High Point Award at PHAA Official Shows the entrant must compete in the corresponding halter event. Approved shows will be given the option to implement this rule.

Insert new rule 225 - YEARLING CERTIFICATE OF EXCELLENCE

- (a) The purpose of this award is to recognise the achievements of Regular Registered and Paint Bred Yearling horses.
(b) In order to qualify for the award the Yearling must have attained a Register of Merit in each of the 4 events of Halter, Led Trail, Lunge Line and Hunter in Hand, before December 31st of their 2 Year Old year.

Rule 237 (i) if two age divisions are to be offered, they shall be 44 yrs and under and 45 yrs and over. Age calculation as at August 1st of each year

PRESIDENTS REPORT - by Craig Dengate

Where are we now? Our association has a responsibility to quote Memorandum Of Association of the PHAA 2a. To do all things and take all such steps as it may from time to time consider necessary for the research, breeding, protection, advancement, promotion or furtherance of Paint Horse Breeding Industry and or the Paint Horse Breeders engaged in that industry and in particular to promote the development of the Paint Horse Breed in Australia.

With this in mind I have proposed that the PHAA ROM to be increased to 20 points. I asked myself a question and considered, how easy it is in the current time to obtain a PHAA ROM, with multijudge shows, National Shows awarding triple points and State Shows awarding double points. I know of several horses which competed in one class of the owners chosen discipline and came out accumulating enough points to receive a PHAA ROM. In recent times we have increased the opportunity for our members and their horses to obtain recognition for their participation in promoting our breed.

I believe originally the PHAA Honour Roll and awards system was created to reward the promotion of Paint Horses and also to develop a standard of excellence for our breed. This award system is used to gauge the excellence and ability that the horse or competitor has achieved. Over the history these awards have been used to reflect standards and provide a benchmark on which we rely on to assess the quality of our horses to be used in our breeding program.

When looking to purchase a horse the attainment of these awards often has a reflection on the asking price of the horse. The prospective purchaser uses these awards to ensure that this horse has a desired level of competency in the chosen discipline

and may tell them something more than what the horse looks like.

Currently our other partners in the western arena, The Quarter Horse Association and the Appaloosa Association require 20 points with restrictions in the type of shows the points are gained at. I believe it is time to raise the qualification for our PHAA ROM to reflect truly in this current time the standard of excellence for our Paint Horses. Remember also the award or a ROM is a requirement of higher PHAA recognized awards, PHAA Superior All Round Horse, PHAA Champion, do we want our paint horses to be truly champions? We also are providing acknowledgement and reward for horses and competitors which have achieved 10 points in their chosen discipline with a certificate of achievement.

Proposal of a new award, member service award. This award is designed to recognize PHAA members who have made exemplary and continual service to members of our association.

Do you remember when you first got involved with paint horses? Some of us had so many questions and not to mention the insecurities of purchasing a horse and not having the experience to assess the horse suitably for yourself. I'm sure at some

stage most of us were in this situation. It is so important for the PHAA to try and provide a good experience for our potential new members or members who are less experienced. In the years I've been involved in horses, I have heard of many experiences where people have purchased a horse and have not been able to have fun on it because of its unsuitability for the owner. Also the situation when a new member has come along unsure of how and why things are done a certain way, just needing a little encouragement or guidance to enjoy and have fun with their paint horse.

There are people in our association, quality people who are realistic about their own level of ability and experience who are the back bone of our association, who put financial gain far behind the valuable experience and enjoyment of their fellow members. With this in mind the association would like to recognize these members.

Looking forward to making your experience with Paint Horses a better one.

Stay tuned, in the next issue I'll give you my run down of our trip to the Victorian State show. Good luck with your upcoming shows and travel safe.

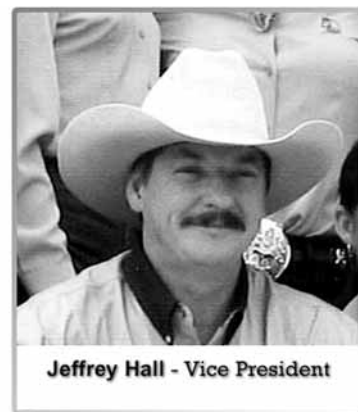

HORSE OWNERS PROTECT AGAINST EMERGENCY DISEASE

The risk of transmitting or contracting disease is at its highest when horses are taken off-farm, so identifying and managing the risks at these times is vital.

Australian Horse Industry Council president Barry Smyth said risk management is very much about keeping a close eye on your horses and those they are mixing with when at horse events, shows or on agistment.

"It's important for all owners and riders to know their horses are healthy and to keep up with vet checks and vaccinations," Mr Smyth said.

"By knowing a horse's characteristics, its eating and drinking habits, normal temperature, heart rate and health status, owners will know when their horses are sick and shouldn't travel. Travelling will only make a sick horse worse and increase disease risk."

Mr Smyth said when people are travelling with horses it is important to exercise the animals during the journey, monitor their health and keep an eye on other horses as well as their own.

"Look out for persistent coughs, running noses and signs of depression in other horses and don't share feed and drink buckets or bedding," Mr Smyth said.

The Paint Horse Association President, Mr Craig Dengate said as horses are a very mobile animal and frequently floated around local areas and the state, potential emergency animal disease risks are high.

"The recreational horse industry is just as critical as all other horse industries. If an emergency animal disease did eventuate, it could close down all horse activities," said Mr Dengate.

"Following routine measures, such as using clean riding and feeding equipment, cleaning transport vehicles after each movement and notifying the authorities of any abnormalities in their horses, helps to mitigate the risks."

If any unusual behaviour or disease symptoms are spotted in horses, or if an unexpected death occurs, owners should call their vet or the Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888.

AMATEUR OWNER REPORT - by Kevin Mills

During the February Board meeting, several Amateur Owner issues were discussed. We have received a question from a member about Amateur Status and the showing of other family members horses.

As our rules are you must own or lease (wholly or in part) the horse that you wish to show in Amateur classes. We do not have provision for an Amateur showing a horse owned by another family member such as husband, wife or child, as is allowed under the rules of some other breed Associations. The Board discussed our present rule and as we do have the option of a Family membership, whereby several people in the one household can be under the same membership and the horses registered into the Family Membership, did not feel that a rule change was warranted. Please keep in mind if you are intending sharing a horse with other family members it may be pertinent to hold a Family Membership (and maybe cheaper too) and have the horses registered into that membership name.

Also up for discussion was the potential for the introduction of 2 Amateur Age Divisions. As with our Youth age divisions, the option is there for clubs to spilt classes by age if they feel the numbers support, or leave just as the one class. Again, as per the Youth Division, there will only be the one Amateur High Point and Honour Roll for the year, this will not be divided into the two age groups. The following is an extract from the Board minutes -

Amateur age divisions – General discussion on introduction of age divisions. AQHA have “select” (45 & over), AAA also offer divisions. **Proposed rule change** – Rule 237 (i) if two age divisions are to be offered, they shall be 44 yrs and under and 45 yrs and over. Age calculation as at August 1st of each year.

An issue was raised regarding the eligibility criteria for Amateurs, if during the points-scoring year an Amateur begins to train professionally, this discussion went on to review the current rule and the following rule change has been implemented - **IMMEDIATE RULE CHANGE** – rule 237. Insert new rule 237 (d) “The Board of Directors has the authority to deny the acceptance or the continuance of a members amateur status if it believes that the applicant does not qualify under terms of rule 237 (i)”. Current (d) becomes (e) and so on.

Requirements for importation of Saddlery and other Equestrian Tack

STORY: PAUL MATTIAZZI

The following information relates to material of quarantine concern that is associated with new saddles and horse equipment. It should give you a good idea of the issues AQIS and importers need to consider when these products are purchased and imported.

Horse equipment made from, or decorated with, rawhide or untreated animal hair/wool poses a significant quarantine risk with the possibility of introducing diseases that affect the animals of origin, such as foot-and-mouth disease, sheep and goat pox, swine vesicular disease, classical swine fever and other diseases of economic and social significance.

Internal components such as straw, untreated wooden saddletrees, or untreated wood padding (e.g. wood shavings) present quarantine risks such as weed seeds and fungal pathogens. Straw, for example has the potential to introduce pests and diseases of cereal crops. Most pest infestation can be determined by inspection although stem borers cannot be detected in this way. The risk of borer and other pest infestation is reduced in beaten, stripped, teased or bleached material.

Inspection and Treatment of New Horse Saddles and Equipment.

An Import Permit is not required for equipment made from synthetic materials, wood products, scoured animal hair/wool and/or untanned animal hide, however documentation or treatment on arrival may be required. Equipment made from or decorated with tanned animal

hide, treated wood products, scoured animal hair/wool or synthetic materials may be released on documentation. Equipment made from or decorated with untreated wood products will require mandatory treatment of either;

- a) Gamma irradiation at 25kGray; or
- b) Fumigation with ethylene oxide (ETO) under initial minimum vacuum of 50 kilopascals at 1500g/m3 for 4 hours at 50oC; or 1500g/m3 for 24 hours at 21oC (T9020).

Note: Untreated wooden saddletrees that are completely covered in fibreglass are exempt from the requirements of mandatory treatments outlined above. A manufacturer's declaration confirming that the saddletrees are completely covered in fibreglass must accompany each consignment.

An Import Permit is required for equipment made from or decorated with straw and/or unscoured animal hair/wool. Permits must be applied for prior to importation. Such equipment must be held until an Import Permit is presented.

An Import Permit may be required for equipment made from or decorated with rawhide. Such equipment must be accompanied by a manufacturer's declaration indicating;

- a) The rawhide is greater than 5 years old; or
- b) The product has been previously gamma irradiated at 50kGray within Australia.

Note: If satisfactory evidence of the age of the rawhide or previous gamma irradiation treatment is not provided, importers have the option of removing the rawhide or applying for an Import Permit and having the rawhide subjected to gamma irradiation at 50 kGray.

As a last resort, importers not wishing to obtain an Import Permit for components of quarantine concern may be provided with the option of removing the relevant component for destruction. Alternatively, the consignment must be re-exported or destroyed.

I hope the above information is helpful and assists importers of these products with making purchasing decisions and helping them understand what is required to clear the equipment through quarantine. There is some additional information available on the ICON database case for new and used horse equipment. ★

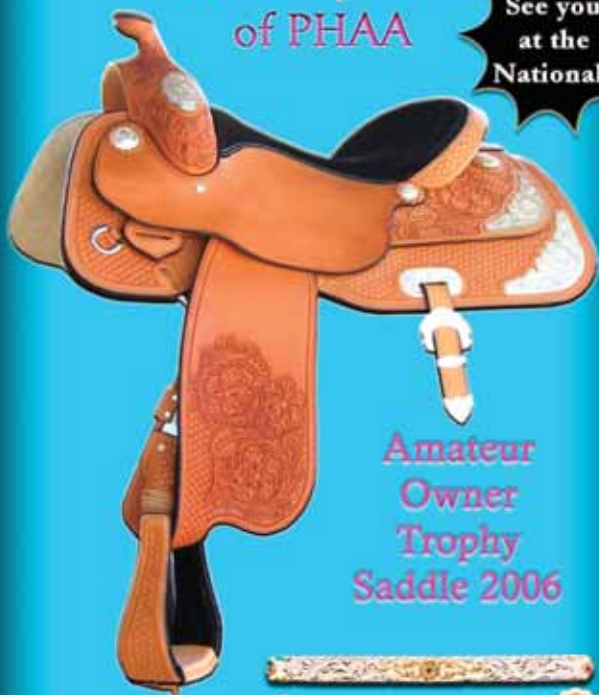

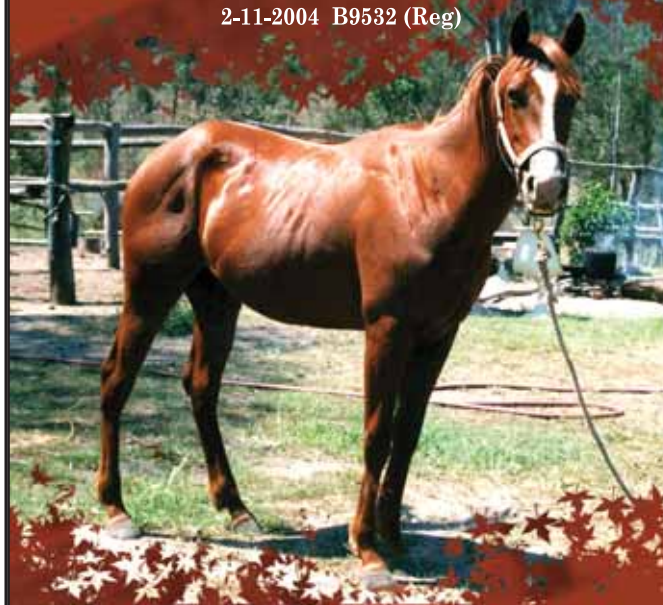

Pearl PAINTS

A very curious new colour has turned up in Paint horses. It is similar to the champagne colour found in Quarter horses. Whereas the Champagne colour is dominant, this colour-diluting gene is recessive. It has been called "Pearl".

But it is curious as I said. It is recessive, thus a Pearl foal must inherit it from both parents to show the effect. But when the Pearl gene is combined with the cream gene (Palomino, Buckskin, Perlino or Cremello) it appears to act as a co-dominant. One copy of the Pearl gene turns a Palomino into an Ivory Champagne colour – almost a Cremello (i.e. a double dilute).

So what does a Pearl look like? **Photo # 1** is a Chestnut Pearl. His name is DMB High and Mighty and he is a son of Mighty Awesome, the Number One Paint Halter stallion in the USA. He has a silvery diluted chestnut colour and a diluted mane and tail. Both of his parents are chestnuts; his dam is a liver chestnut. This colt is one of the best

Paint horses that we have ever bred and to have him both an overo and a Pearl is really exciting.

Photo # 2 is a Pearl Palomino. His sire is Mighty Awesome and his dam is a palomino. He would easily be confused with a Cremello but he can't be one as his dad is a chestnut. His eye colour started off bluish then went to a hazel colour then to a greenish amber. His mouth and most soft skin parts are spotted brown on pink skin. This is a spectacular ivory-silver horse. His name is Burkes Awesome Gold and he stands at Trinity Park Stud, Cranebrook, NSW.

Most of the Pearl Paint horses descend from Barlink Macho

Man (Mighty Awesome's dad) and it was originally named the "Barlink Factor" or "Barlink Champagnes".

The pinkish skin with darker freckles seems to be present on some horses and not on others. It is claimed that in single dose Pearls (carriers), while the chestnut coat colour is unaltered, the skin colour is often pinkish with freckles.

This mutation is also recorded in Iberian horses and in Peruvian Pasos. Obviously another Spanish mutation spread by the Conquistadors.

In summary:

- they look like silvery chestnuts (chestnut Pearls).
- or ivory champagnes (Palomino Pearls).
- one copy of the Pearl gene doesn't change a Chestnut's colour.
- two copies of the Pearl gene does change a chestnut's colour.
- one copy of the Pearl gene plus Palomino creates a double dilute ivory champagne colour.
- skin colour is often pinkish with brown freckles see photo 3.
- eyes are usually blue when foals turning to a greenish. amber by the age of two – see photos 4 & 5.

Most Pearl paints descend from Barlink Macho Man

The Pearl colour is quite magnificent. In the years ahead it will probably become much more common. At the moment they are as rare as hen's teeth. We only know of our two definite Pearls in Australia. The Pearl chestnuts are unforgettable, almost ghost horses. ☆

Most regional clubs have a small core of workers who commit time and effort for the benefit of you the member, without these workers there would not be a club for you to show at. Definition of club, association for pursuance of common interest! Try to put aside personal differences for common interest of the club. Regional clubs are a starting point for most new people, you have an important role to play in the betterment of your association, without regional clubs there are no starting points where people can enjoy what you have enjoyed in the past.

Not all people are cut out to be involved in the management of a club, but sometimes a word of appreciation goes a long way.

REVISED REGIONAL CLUBS REQUIREMENTS AND BENEFITS

The Regional Clubs Rules and requirements have been revised as a consequence of suggestions put forward by our members who attended the workshop at last years National Show. Some of the changes that have made are -

A relaxation in the membership requirements of executive committee and club members:

- At least one executive committee member of a regional club must be a financial PHAA member.
- All regional clubs must have of at least five (5) PHAA members.

Requirements to the activities held by each club have also been amended:

Affiliated clubs must run a minimum of two (2) PHAA approved shows per year and one (1) other function eg. show, clinic, promotional day etc.

All regional clubs are to provide an audited copy of their balance sheet and provide a copy of annual general meeting minutes each year to the PHAA as part of their affiliation. Previously minutes of all meetings were required.

Show Approval Fees have been reviewed and to encourage clubs to hold approved shows an annual fee has been introduced.

Affiliated clubs may pay a blanket \$100- per year annual Show Approval fee that will allow approval of all shows within the year August 1st to July 31st, provided there are no changes to the program as originally submitted. The requirement to advise the name of the judge will be relaxed to 14 days prior to each show date. Should there be any changes to the program a new approval fee will apply. Other approval requirements stand.

Affiliated clubs will be entitled to apply annually for :

- Trophy for High Point Paint Horse of the Year.
- High Point Amateur and High Point Youth Buckle for a PHAA Approved State Show.
- 6 Champion & 6 Reserve Champion sashes.
- Information packs for distribution.
- \$300 - Grant for approved camps or clinics (minimum 2 day duration) conditional.

Affiliated clubs may apply for a \$10- levy for each new PHAA member signed up by and submitted by the club.

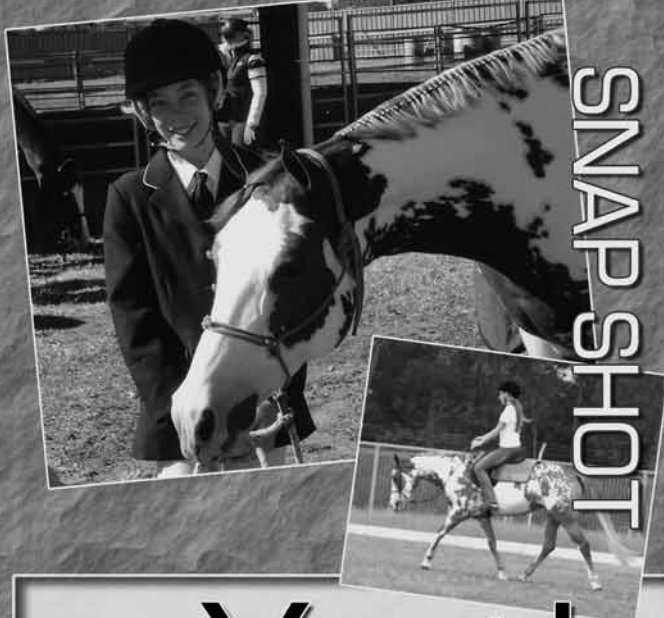

PHAA Youth Trip GUIDELINES...

- Four Youth will be selected for the Team to make the trip to America plus one Reserve. Attendance of the reserve member is at the discretion of the Board.
- The selected Youth must be current financial members of the PHAA & AjPHA at the time of the trip, must not be married or have been married.
- Minimum age is to be 14 years at date of departure. Maximum age eligible 18 before the second of January of the year of the show.
- Youth to be a member of good standing for a minimum period of two years prior to closing date of final qualifying Honour Roll.
- Selection is based on accumulation of points over the previous two years taken from the end of 2006/2007 year Honour Roll results. The Top 10 Youth are eligible for consideration. It is mandatory to have competed and obtained points in both of the two qualifying Honour Roll years.
- Each of the eligible youth must submit to the Board their reasons for wishing to be part of the team in the form of an essay "Why I should be selected" being a minimum of 1 A4 page, which would include past history with horses, experience in voluntary assistance with shows and/or club activities, team work, fundraising activities and any other relevant matters. The Board then scrutinises each applicant and arrives at the top 5.
- The Board will aim to advise the successful applicants by October 1st
- Two written references are required to be submitted to the Board
- Evidence must be provided that the eligible Youth has acted as a steward or arena assistant on at least 2 occasions.
- The five finalists will be expected to attend a State or National Show and be involved in Youth activities and assist in the running of the show by assisting as ring steward, ribbon steward or other assistant as directed.
- Minimum of two Team Managers (one male & one female) to take responsibility for all Youth. Team Managers must be over 30 years of age, and financial members of the PHAA at the time of the trip.
- Team Managers must nominate themselves for approval by the PHAA Board. The attending Youth will then nominate their preferred Team Managers, the Board of Directors will then make the final selection.
- Parents / Guardians of Team Members cannot be Team Managers.
- Team Managers are not permitted to take their own children on the trip.



- The PHAA Board of Directors has the right to appoint Team Managers.
- Parents of Youth can accompany them on the trip, but not be part of the official group or be involved in the management.
- All Team Managers and accompanying adults will be required to undertake and sign the "Working With Children".
- Team Managers airfares and accommodation will be paid for by Youth fundraising and other PHAA fundraising. All other expenses will be met by the Team Managers themselves.
- Each Youth is responsible for raising a preset amount. All funds raised must be lodged with the PHAA by a set date prior to the trip.
- If the individual target is not reached then that Youth will not go.
- A fundraising record sheet must be submitted to the PHAA by the due date of funds.
- Parents may contribute to their Youths fundraising.
- Money raised will be held in a Youth Trip Account, with any excess after expenses being carried over to the Youth Portfolio. There will be no refunds.
- Youth are responsible for the cost of their own private telephone calls.
- Selected Youth will receive an invitation, which, if accepted, must be signed by parent/ guardian. If the invitation is declined, the offer will be given to the next youth or so on. Youth found to be submitting fraudulent points sheets will not be considered.
- When accepted, Youth and their parents are bound by the agreement to raise the required funds etc. if they intend to be part of the team.
- The PHAA Board has the right to remove or expel a member of the team for breaches of PHAA rules, inappropriate behavior or other reasons as deemed by the Board from time to time.
- Should a team member be unable to attend, the PHAA Board may select the reserve member or next qualifying youth to attend the Youth Trip on the same conditions.
- Activities away from the World Show shall be at the total discretion of the Team Managers.
- There will be a code of behavior for the qualifying youth and their parents / caregivers to sign
- A written report will be required from each youth participant within 3 weeks of their return. Failure to do so may void eligibility for future Youth Team Trips.

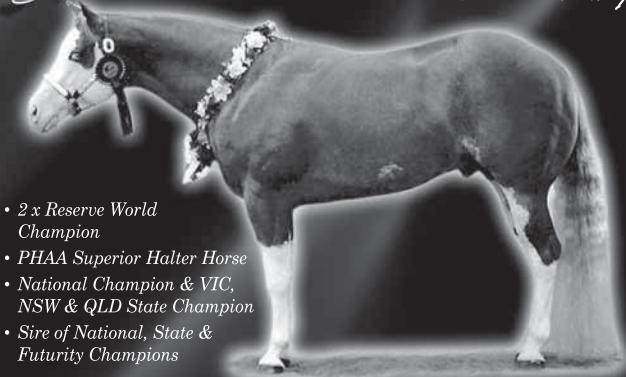
