Office Report by Ron Tidyman - DECEMBER08/JANUARY09

Hi, my name is Ron Tidyman and this is my first report as the (relatively) new PHAA Office Manager. I commenced work with the Paint Horse Association about 8 weeks ago and whilst I have no experience whatsoever with horses I do have more than 30 years experience as a manager. I have always believed that given my management experience I could handle any job so I did not think not knowing anything about horses would be a draw back. To a certain extent I have found this to be true. "Where my lack of specific horse knowledge is a drawback, is in my ability to answer technical questions from members. But I am on a steep learning curve and learning more everyday!

PAPERWORK FRUSTRATIONS...

I would like to state up front that I am fully aware of and very concerned about the frustrating members experienced dealing with the office over the past several months. When I started work there were three trestle tables groaning under the weight of paperwork waiting to be processed and there were only two staff members trying their best to work their way through the mountain of administration. With the support of the Board of Directors I was able to employ a third office person, a financial controller on a contract basis

for one day per week as well as casual employee to focus on updating the Show Points and Affiliated Club information. After 8 weeks the team has made tremendous inroads into the backlog and while we are still not right up to date we are very close to being so. I know that some members will disagree with this statement given that the Office still experiences some delays meeting their expectations. Occasionally we are still finding outstanding paperwork from months ago that may have been misfiled or overlooked. However the three trestle tables have been reduced to a couple

of plastic in trays and we are moving forward little by little every day.

• TELEPHONE FRUSTRATIONS...

I know how frustrating and annoying it is not to be able to contact a business or office by telephone. We have all had the misfortune of being bounced around by recorded messages or a computer voice asking us to press one button after another and in the end not be able to speak to anyone anyway. Many of the members have let me know directly, in no uncertain terms, what they think about the telephone "service" they experience from the office. Unfortunately there is no easy fix to this problem. I have arranged with our phone company to have a second line added in what is known as a "rotary" configuration. This means that if the first line is busy the call rotates to another line and a phone rings in the office. In theory this means we can answer twice as many calls in any given time. However that is the upside, the downside is that while we now have 2 office staff taking calls they are unable to process any paperwork. A classic Catch 22!

I know a lot of members do not believe we get as many phone calls as we actually do but it is true. On some days the phones ring constantly. It really is a case of ending one call to answer another. It is my belief that this situation will for the most part be rectified when we have the administration fully up to date because the majority of our calls are from members wanting to know where their paperwork is. The irony of this is that the more calls we field to answer this question is that it takes longer to process the paperwork. Could this be another classic catch 22?

• EMAIL FRUSTRATIONS....

Since starting with PHAA I have found emails have been as much of a frustration for our members as telephone calls. I "inherited" about 500 unread emails. And while I tried to review and / or answer as many as I could I finally had to file a lot of the old mail away so that I could move onto current business. The issue with making that decision was that some important communications members did not get actioned when they should have. No email message was deleted so I can, as I have done on numerous occasions, use a search function to retrieve a message that a member has asked me to follow up on. I believe email response time from the office has improved significantly in the last few weeks. As part of my morning routine I read all messages received overnight and where practical respond immediately even if my response is just to say I will get back to the writer soon!

• IT'S NOT ALL DOOM & GLOOM...

If you have stuck with me and read to this point you may be thinking that there is not a lot of good news from the office. To be perfectly honest there have been days when I felt the same. However I can see a light at the end of the tunnel and I am confident it is not an oncoming train!

The Paint Horse Association of Australia is a growing and vibrant organisation. My team and I are all working hard to improve the service that members receive from the Office. I am very excited about the direction the Association is heading and I can see so many areas of opportunity for further development and growth. The thing that really stands out for me in my short time with PHAA is the passion everyone has for the breed. I have worked for companies in the past that touted slogans like "A Passion for Excellence" however compared to our members and their Passion for Paints the aforementioned slogans seem very hollow to me now.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Office team for all their hard work. Each person in the office is committed to improving service levels and each of the team members is equally committed to making the PHAA the best horse Association in the country. In case you have not had any contact with our current team let me introduce them to you:

Amy – who was our longest serving staff member left the PHAA recently and is pursuing other interests and opportunities. She had worked for the Association for a bit more than 18 months. Amy has a wealth of knowledge about all things horse related and her knowledge will be missed in the office."

Tammy – has been with us for about 9 months. She has shown an exceptional ability to learn the business in a short period of time. She has a very good grasp of most aspects of the Association as they relate to members needs.

Amber - is our newest recruit. Amber has a real passion for horses though this is her first involvement with the Paint breed. She is rapidly getting up to speed in many areas of the office work and after just a few weeks she is handling several different accountabilities extremely well.

Debbie - is our contracted Financial Controller. She is an absolute whiz with numbers and she has been able to make sense of and sort out most of our accounting issues.

Kim - works for us on a casual basis looking after Shows & Points. She has done an outstanding job in a very short period of time and she has her accountability very much up to date. Any member who has dealt with the office over the last several years will

• IT'S YOUR OFFICE...

So how can you help the office get up to speed and stay that way? In another part of the journal I have listed a few things you can do when dealing with the office which will help speed up the paperwork for everyone.

- Submitting your Points
- a reminder from Kim

As per Rule 218 - Open, Amateur Owner and Youth classes are to be grouped together and submitted on separate forms.

- The information submitted with regard to the number of entrants in events and the placings awarded must be accurate. All forms are cross checked and random, spot checks are performed. Points are disallowed where incorrect information is submitted.
- A copy of the Show Program is to accompany the Show result form.
- Result forms are to be received into the PHAA office within 30 days from the show date. If received between 30-60 days a penalty of \$25.00 per sheet will be incurred and result forms will be invalid if received after 60 days from the date of the show.

MEMBERS... HOW YOU CAN HELP THE OFFICE?

Following are a few suggestions that you can follow to help the office catch up and stay up to date.

- Double check that you have all required paper work (and photographs) before you send your application for registration or transfer to the office. Most forms include a checklist.
- Ensure all photographs supplied are of good quality and clearly show all of your horse including the hoofs and ears!
- Write your horse's name on the back of any photographs you send to the office.
- If you are sending printed photos, ensure you print them on proper photo paper (not plain paper) Emailed or mailed electronic photos are acceptable but must be of good quality
- Include the correct payment with you paperwork.
- Use the current forms. All forms are available on the website or from the office.

- Submit your paperwork on time i.e. futurity payments, transfers, breeding returns etc.
- Respond promptly to requests for additional information.
- Submit all requests in writing in the correct format. This
 creates a paper trail that can be tracked if something
 goes missing.
- Check QH mare breeding for mares foaled after 31/07/1990. Any "A" numbered mares must show blood line of 2 generations. Rule 102 of PHAA Rule Book.
- If you telephone the office have all information relevant to your query to hand. This will help speed up your query and allow others to get through to the office as well.
- If you have a general enquiry / question check the website first. A lot of the information is available online.
- If your enquiry / question is not of an urgent nature try sending us an e-mail. Include as much information as you can when you frame your enquiry.



PHAA - Immediate Rule Change

RULE 236(a) PHAA YOUTH ACTIVITY PROGRAMME – YOUTH TRIP

Explanation:

The Board has reviewed the wording of Rule 236(a) which covers, in part, the selection of the PHAA Youth Team. This will clarify the selection criteria and assist youth to meet their obligations. Additional wording is in italics.

- (a) Only Youth who meet all the selection criteria will be invited to apply for a position on the Youth Team. Four Youth will be selected for the Team to make the trip to America plus on Reserve. Attendance of the Reserve member is at the discretion of the Board.
- (b) Selected Youth will receive an invitation, which, if accepted, must be signed by a parent/guardian. If the invitation is declined, the offer will be given to the next youth and so on. Youth found to be submitting fraudulent point sheets will not be considered.
- (c) When accepted, Youth and their parents are bound by the agreement to raise the required funds.
- (d) The selected Youth must be current financial members of the PHAA and AjPHA at the time of the trip, must not be married or have been married.
- (e) Minimum age is to be 14 years at the date of departure. Maximum age eligible is 18 before the second of January of the year of the show.
- (f) Youth must be a member of good standing for a minimum period of two years prior to the closing date of the final qualifying year.
- (g) Selection is based on accumulation of points over the previous two years taken from the relevant end of year Honour Roll results. In order to be considered for selection, the Youth must have appeared and qualified on the "Top 10 Youth" listing for at least one of the two qualifying years. Points from both qualifying years are accumulated whether on the Top 10 listing for one or both years. It is mandatory to have competed and obtained points in both of the two qualifying Honour Roll years.
- (h) Points will not be taken into consideration which have been earned in category 7.
- (i) Each of the eligible youth must submit to the Board their reasons for wishing to be part of the team in the form of an essay titled 'Why I should be selected' and should be a minimum of 1 A4 page. This essay should include history with horses, detail of voluntary assistance with shows and/or club activities, team work, fundraising activities and any other relevant information.

- (j) Two written reference must be submitted to the Board with the essay.
- (k) Each selected Youth must, on acceptance of their invitation, sign a form of agreement with the PHAA that they agree with the guidelines and will work to raise the requisite amount of funds, and will accept the event selected for them without question and with good grace.
- (1) The five finalists will be expected to attend a State or National Show and be involved in Youth activities and assist in the running of the show by assisting as ring steward, ribbon steward or other activities as directed.
- (m) Each youth is responsible for raising a preset amount as decided by the Board. All funds must be lodged with the PHAA by 30 April of the year of travel or on a date to be determined by the Board.
- (n) Each youth must lodge with the PHAA Office by the end of each month details of funds raised and deposited in the past month.
- (o) If the individual target is not reached then that Youth will not travel.
- (p) Money raised will be held in the Youth Trip Account, with any excess after expenses being carried over to the Youth Portfolio. There will be no refunds.
- (q) The PHAA Board has the right to remove or expel a member of the team for breaches of PHAA rules, inappropriate behaviour or other reasons deemed by the Board from time to time.
- (r) Should a team member be unable to attend, the PHAA Board may select the reserve member or next qualifying youth to attend the Youth Trip on the same conditions.
- (s) A written report is required from each Youth Team participant within 3 weeks of their return. Failure to do so may void eligibility for future Youth Team Trips.
- t) Parents/Guardians of all Youth Team Members must complete a document detailing dietary or medical requirements or conditions that may require attention and emergency contact details.

With the sun out bright the next day, it was time to head off into the Canyon but this time on horse back. Now here's the weird thing we went private ride through the canyon, we







We were given our horses for our lesson to saddle and lead out to the arena where Bill was already working and giving another lesson to a student. Mel was given a bay mare who appeared to be very nervous on the ground and I was given a chestnut gelding. We headed out to lunge them first as per our instructions. Mel was a little unsure of her mare and I was quite happy to have the gelding. Mel put one foot in the stirrup and got on and like a switch the little nervous mare turned into rock solid ride.

Bill gave us three minutes to do the exercises we had learnt at his clinic in Sydney and then he was going to ask us to explain the strengths and weaknesses of each of our horses. PHOTOGRAPH REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION

- 1. All applications for registration must be accompanied by a set of at least four photographs as provided in the PHAA Official Rule Book. These should be taken in good light and include a front view, a rear view and views of both sides of the horse. The entire profile of the horse must be in the photograph. Pictures are also required on Breeding Stock applications.
- 2. If the horse being photographed is roan, gray, white or palomino, good photographs may be difficult to obtain. Thoroughly wetting the area to be photographed may help distinguish the white markings.
- 3. Excessively long hair, dirt, mud, etc. will detract from the white markings and may cause PHAA to write for additional photographs. Pictures taken a distance from the horse (for instance, horse running in a pasture or within a group of other horses) are usually not acceptable.
- 4. If the "natural paint marking" that is believed to qualify the horse for the Regular Registry is of minimal size or is not clearly visible in the four photographs, additional pictures must be submitted. A qualifying area(s) must be one solid white area in excess of 50mm, within the prescribed zone, with some underlying unpigmented skin. Unpigmented skin photographs are not required if the qualifying area is an extension of the blaze, chin white or stockings.
- * Photographs should be taken outside with no flash (morning or evening lighting is best).
- * The qualifying area(s) must be clean and the photographs should be taken as close to the spot as possible, yet to include the entire spot, and remain CLEARLY in focus.
- * Please remove halters for photographs of the head.

- * When using a ruler instead of the PHAA circle, be sure the numbers are large and visible in the photographs.
- * Polaroids are not acceptable as many times do not produce a clear photograph.
- Light colored horses should be wet to clearly show markings.

BODY SPOTS

Photographs of the body spots should include, and must be taken, in the following order:

- 1. closeup of the spot(s) before clipping
- closeup of the spot(s) and surrounding area after the area has been clipped (not shaved)
- closeup of the spot(s) with the PHAA circle or ruler held beside the spot(s)
- closeup of the spot(s) with the PHAA circle or ruler held directly across the center of the spot(s) (the white must exceed the circle on two opposite sides)
- 5. closeup of the spot(s) after the area has been shaved (completely remove the hair) to clearly show the unpigmented (pink) skin. (We do not recommend using hair removal products as allergic reactions may affect the appearance of the skin.)

HEAD AND LEG MARKINGS

• HEAD MARKINGS:

Photographs of the extension of a blaze should be taken from a direct sideview with the ruler held beside the outermost portion of white. Photographs should be taken in a manner to include the horse's entire head from the tips of the ears to the tip of the chin with the ears forward.

• CHIN MARKINGS:

Photographs of the extension of the chin white should be taken with a ruler held beside the outermost portion of white. The corner of the mouth must be clearly visible.

• FRONT LEG MARKINGS:

Photographs should be taken to clearly show the entire leg from the floor of the chest to below the knee with a ruler held beside the uppermost extension of white. The entire knee must be clearly visible. The horse must be standing squarely and the camera held level to the area being photographed.

• REAR LEG MARKINGS:

Photographs should be taken to clearly show the entire leg from the flank/stifle area to below the hock with a ruler held beside the uppermost extension of white. The hock must be clearly visible.

The horse must be standing squarely and the camera held level to the area being photographed.

• DISCONNECTED LEG MARKINGS:

Photographs of disconnected leg spots should be taken to clearly show the hock and stifle for hind legs or the knee and floor of the chest for front legs as well as the underlying unpigmented skin.

The horse must be standing squarely and the camera held level to the area being photographed. See instructions in previous section for taking photographs of body spots.

Good photographs submitted in the manner described above will aid in the registration of the horse. If good photographs are sent with the registration application initially, it will help PHAA in determining the horse's status and eligibility in a more timely manner.



Hunter In Hand Dress Suggestions



Dress:

- HAIR: Neat, long hair plaited and tied up securely. Cap optional (English flat cap derby traditional).
 - NO western hats, caps or English hunting helmets
- SHIRT: Long or short sleeved shirt with collar and buttons. Shirts should be tucked into pants. Tie optional but must be pinned down. Long sleeved shirt with tie preferred for men.
 - NO western stud snaps or yokes and NO western style tie studs
- PANTS: Loose dress 'riata' style. If the pants have belt loops, a belt MUST be worn, small leather dress belt.
 - NO western trophy buckles, no jeans and no jodhpurs or track pants.
- BOOTS: Leather paddock boots or suede terrain walking style with zippers, elastic or laces, darker colours preferred. White soft shoes or joggers are permitted but are not preferred in Australia.
 - NO white soft shoes or joggers.

EXTRAS:

- · Gloves: traditional short, leather or cotton.
- Vests: In cooler weather, wool or tweed fabrics, no western styles.
- Jewellery: discreet English designs only.
- · Ratcatcher style collar suitable for women.

OTHER INFORMATION:

The way I see it, the handler of the horse is equivalent to the head groom at a hunting stable. They are not going to ride the horse - therefore no jodhpurs, long boots or hunting caps required. They are displaying the horse as a hunting prospect to impress a client (in this case the judge) who intends to use the horse for riding in hunter classes.

Logos, brand names or stripes on clothing are NOT recommended. These are not permitted in the States and a US judge will frown upon these.

Traditional, subdued, English colours and materials are preferred.

Hendra Virus Advice for Horse Owners & Carers

Clinical Signs Seen in Horses

The following clinical signs have all been associated with Hendra Virus (HeV) cases but not all of these signs will be found in any one infected horse. HeV has to be considered as a possible cause in horses that:

- · Rapid onset of illness;
- Fever (39-40 degrees Celcius);
- Rapid deterioration;
- Respiratory signs;
- · Neurological signs (loss of balance, loss of vision, head tilt, circling);
- Elevated heart rate (recorded up to 100 beats/minute);
- · Facial swelling.

HeV is a **notifiable disease** which means that any person (including horse owners, carers and veterinarians) who suspects, diagnoses or confirms the presence of HeV **must** notify the nearest government biosecurity inspector immediately on:

- DPI&F's information centre on 13 25 23 (business hours) or
- Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline 1800 675 888 (any time).

Clearly state to the person answering the phone that you are calling in regards to a suspect case of HeV.

Reduce the Risk - Biosecurity Considerations for Horses

The steps below can help to reduce the risk of your horse getting infected with HeV:

- Do not place feed and water containers under trees, particularly if flying foxes are attracted to those trees;
- Ideally, remove horses from paddocks where there are flowering /fruiting trees (eg. mango, fig). Return the horses after the trees have stopped flowering/fruiting;
- Do not use feed that might be attractive to flying foxes- fruit/vegetables or foods that are sweet (molasses);
- Ensure all equipment used with horses is clean before use and between use on different horses.
 This includes equipment such as nasogastric tubes, teeth rasps.

Hendra virus is very susceptible to detergents, soaps and the following disinfectants:

· Phenols, Quaternary Ammonium Compounds (QACs), Biguanides, Iodophores)

Practical examples of these are DettolTM, alcoholic chlorhexidine, iodine solutions (BetadineTM) and SavlonTM. (sourced: AUSVETPLAN)

Iodine solutions are inactivated by organic material (manure, blood etc) so this should be washed off before using this disinfectant.

The incubation period in horses (time from exposure to first signs) is between 5 and 16 days. Once a horse is showing clinical signs the illness progresses rapidly over a few days.

Reduce the Risk - Biosecurity Considerations for People

Although uncommon, horse to human infections has resulted from close contact with infected horses. HeV can cause life-threatening illness and people should be cautious with possible cases and ensure personal safety of themselves, their workers and others whenever there is a suspicion of HeV. HeV is

NOT highly infectious and the spread of infection between horses and people can be minimised by good biosecurity measures such as:

- Wash hands with soap and water regularly during and after handling multiple horses;
- Wear appropriate clothing and gloves to reduce contact with saliva and other discharges from sick horses;
- Keep unwashed hands away from you eyes, mouth and nose.

Workplace Health & Safety Precautions

Employers of businesses involving handling horses have a duty of care to provide a safe work place.

A plan for responding to a potential HeV case should be developed to prevent or minimise the risk to workers and others.

Background

Hendra virus (HeV) was first isolated in 1994 and it is considered an emerging disease. Stringent biosecurity measures are necessary as the virus has the potential to be a serious disease that can transfer from animals to people (zoonosis). Although uncommon, horse to human infections have resulted from close contact with infected horses. HeV has caused death in 3 people. There are important public health and workplace health and safety issues that need to be considered by all people in contact with horses and careful management of any possible HeV situation is required. HeV has been confirmed on eleven properties, ten of these are in Queensland and one in northern NSW.

Flying foxes are the natural reservoir of HeV. How HeV transmission occurs between flying foxes and from flying foxes to horses is not yet known. Virus has been identified in the birthing fluids, placental material and aborted pups of flying foxes. The scientific information available for HeV is not complete and is still the subject of on going research.

Some Progesterone Injections Doubtful For Mares That "Slip" Foals

Mares that "slip" (abort) foals are a common problem for stud managers. In some cases this is due to infection, but in other cases it is thought to be due to low progesterone levels. For this reason a commonly used treatment has been injections of hydroxyprogesterone caproate.concentrations.

An Australian study by Dr Angus McKinnon and colleagues from the Goulburn Valley Equine Hospital and the Universities of Monash and Melbourne (AO McKinnon, S Tarrida Del Marmol Figueroa, AM Nobelius and JH Hyland Failure of hydroxyprogesterone caproate to maintain pregnancy in ovariectomised mares Equine Vet.

J. Vol 25 No. 2, pg 158) has shown that in mares that have had their ovaries surgically removed,injections of hydroxyprogesterone caproate given at a dose of 500mg every 7 days could not maintain pregnancy.

However, oral altrenogest (Regumate®) administered daily was effective in maintaining pregnancy. It appears that some progesterone injections are

ineffective at providing adequate progesterone concentrations.

Dr. Mckinnon believes that of all mares that "slip" foals in the early stages of pregnancy, perhaps less than 1% will be responsive to progesterone treatment. Embryo death in the early stages of pregnancy is a very common problem for the horse breeding industry. Further research work in this area is critical.

Water for horses

Transported horses on a stopover or horses that are housed temporarily for competition or racing may be required to drink from a watering system that they have never seen before.

It is often very important that these horses drink because of the risk of dehydration

from transport or athletic competition. There are many types of automatic watering systems available and a research team in Texas, USA have investigated which types of automatic watering system are most preferred by horses that have never seen such systems before.

The horses in the study greatly preferred the watering systems that refilled by a float valve over those that refilled by a push valve. The horses drank most readily from the watering system that had a large open bowl, refilled quietly and created the least amount of turbulence when refilling.

Rib Fracture Diagnosis...

Foals can sometimes suffer rib fractures as the result of a difficult birth or throughaccidental injury.

Accurate diagnosis of rib fractures in foals is important so that appropriate care can be given. A study conducted at the University of Montreal compared the accuracy of diagnosis of rib fractures in foals using ultrasonography*, radiography (xrays) and physical examination.

Ultrasonography was found to be the most accurate method for diagnosisng rib fractures in foals.

Australian Stringhalt...

Equine veterinarians and the media have reported that the incidence of Australian stringhalt has been very high this past summer and into autumn, especially in some areas of Victoria.

Stringhalt results from damage to the long nerves and is characterised by an exaggerated flexion of one or both hind legs and 'roaring' in some horses. Affected horses may show mild signs only when backed or stopped suddenly and other cases may be so severe that the front of the fetlock hits the belly with each stride.

Australian stringhalt is thought to be caused by ingestion of flatweed (Hypochoeris radicata). This weed is prevalent in times of drought, particularly through summer and autumn.

If you suspect that a horse may be affected by Australian stringhalt contact your veterinarian for advice. More information on this condition is contained in the RIRDC book Plants Poisonous to horses - An Australian Field Guide.

New test for heart problems...

Australian research has found that blood plasma measurements of a complex of proteins known as troponin could be used to indicate heart damage in horses.

The test can be readily carried out using current laboratory testing equipment. In normal horses the expected level of troponin in plasma samples would be close to zero and higher readings indicate that heart damage is occurring.

This test may prove useful in the detection of active heart damage, such as might occur with recent exposure to toxins that affect the heart, such as monensin (an additive found in cattle and poultry feed that is toxic to horses).


