

Consequently on occasion it may seem to some members that the "office" is not supporting their particular needs. Nothing could be further from the truth.

I would like to assure you that the office staff will always do whatever they can to assist members whilst working within their level of authority. The office staff do develop, over time, a lot of knowledge about how the Association functions, horse characteristics, show requirements etc. however it should be noted that they may not necessarily be the "experts" you need to answer a particular question. Each member of the PHAA Board of Directors is responsible for one or more portfolios and the Board members are more than happy for members to contact them if they have a question, comment or concern.

You can assist the "office" to perform at its optimum level by ensuring that all paperwork you submit for action is complete and accurate. While it may seem at times that we do ask for quite a lot of information everything asked for is needed. Application to register a horse is a good example of a process that is quite complex. The detailed information requested is needed to ensure that the integrity of the Paint Horse bloodline is maintained. Enjoy the holiday season and have a great Christmas & New Year. The office team is looking forward to a bigger, brighter 2011.

PAINT GELDING QUALIFIES FOR 2011 HACKING 'GRAND NATIONAL' ...

Wisteria Park Kiss, a 4 year old Paint gelding (Belvedere Watch the Paint- Love N War) bred by Wisteria Park Paint & Pinto Stud, and owned and ridden by Ashley Harris, Qld, is believed to be the first 'coloured' horse ever to qualify for an event that is the pinnacle of all Australian Hacking competition; the Show Horse Council Grand National Show, which will be held at the Sydney International Equestrian Centre in 2011. This achievement is quite possibly an Australian first. As anyone who is familiar with the Hacking scene would know, it is deeply entrenched with scores of years of tradition, and it used to be almost impossible to even place in an Agricultural Show Hack or Rider class with a coloured horse. 'Whisky'' wasn't even broken in until he was 3 years old and in the short time since then, his first season under

saddle, he has earned an amazing number of Championships in Led Hack and Show Hunter classes, Hack and Rider classes and ANSA classes. Entries in many of his classes were often around 25 to 35 horses. In addition to competing and winning in Paint and Pinto Championships, he was competing at all the big Agricultural and Hack shows in Queesnland against all 'solid' coloured horses. Then at the Show Horse Council Nth Qld Hack Championships in 2010, (a Grand National Qualifier) he achieved Runner-Up Intermediate Hack, 3rd Open Hunter hack and he carried Ashley to Champion Lady Rider 18 – 21 years, thus qualifying twice for the Grand Nationals next year. He also carried Ashley's youngest sister Tyler to 3rd place in the rider 15-17 years. Definitely a Paint to 'watch'.

APHA WORLD SHOW ...

Craig Dengate has been having quite a good time at the APHA World Show in Fort Worth Texas. Competing in Amateur Owner classes under 5 judges at a time, Craig secured a 5th place out of 12 entries with his 2yo mare "Mulitiples", and 9th out of 14 with his 3yo mare "Irreplaceable". The mare was also shown in the Open 3yo Mares class by Texan trainer Mike Mc Millian and came in with a 5th out of 14. Craig's weanling colt "Exemplary" was shown in the Non-Pro Weanling Stallions and Geldings Slot Futurity for a 3rd from 4 entries.

The Paint Horse Society of South Australia Inc (PHSSA) and Northern Regional Appaloosa Society of South Australia Inc (NRAC) have joined forces to present a joint State Show in 2011. The initial brainchild of Pam Buchan (currently President of both Clubs), it has the backing of the AAA Board. Said Pam "For two small Clubs to hold individual small shows is not viable. Together we can attract up to 60 horses with their riders/handlers over a two and a half day programme. Since both breeds show under HSAA rules, we can share both the judge and venue costs."

This venture continues the co-operation between the Paint and NRAC Clubs in SA. They already hold a joint show – The Northern Classic – in October, which is fast becoming a permanent feature in the show calendar and it will allow both breeds to promote themselves to more spectators than a single show would attract.

The Show programme will be integrated, with separate classes for Paints, Paintbreds and Appaloosas. Two ring stewards will ensure that the breed results are kept separate. Each Club will be responsible for their entries, ribbons, trophies and point scoring. Jan Boyd, Treasurer of both Clubs, said that "Cost savings made by combining the shows may allow us to offer prizemoney for the first time. In addition to the breed classes, we are planning some feature events in the evenings, open to all breeds, including a memorial class named for the late Lance Pink, and incorporating some of our good local entertainment." Timing of the combined State Show has

been the biggest headache as the Clubs have had to fit around other State and National events. Finally the dates have been agreed as 29th and 30th April, 1st May 2011. The venue is Northern Equestrian Centre at Penfield. Normally PHSSA includes an All Breeds Show with their State Show. Since all the Sundays from January to April are already booked for Western events in SA, they have chosen to run it on a Saturday, 26th February, with the NRAC monthly show the next day, thus providing a full weekend of showing for competitors under two separate judges.

Both Clubs hope that this joint venture will become a permanent feature and lead to bigger and better shows in future years.

Rule 210 states that all horses entered into approved shows must be registered. If a horse is unregistered and is shown at an approved show, the owner and/or exhibitor may be suspended from the association. If you are a show organiser please be aware of this rule.

-2011 NATIONAL SHOW -PAINT THE TOWN

The 2011 National Show will be held in Tamworth again at the AELEC centre commencing the 3rd March, 2011. There are a host of new events including campdrafting (cattle pending), show jumping, team penning, open events, teams events, more youth events as well as AO events and more paintbred classes. The futurities will again be feature events as well.

One of the biggest changes for this Nationals will be the timing of the weanling and yearling futurities. These have now been scheduled for mornings when the younger horses are at their best.

The feature barrel race will also be accompanied by a Stake race, which is American pole bending. This will be in aid of the Prostate Cancer Foundation and is being coordinated by Alison Lord. Advertising of the event has already commenced, so we are hopeful of a great number of entrants to entertain and help raise much needed funds for this worthy foundation.

The team penning will be run by the Upper Hunter Team Penning Association. This association is also known for running the team penning for the Sydney Royal Show and other major events, so they are well organised and prepared. Team penning is growing in popularity and it will be evident at our show, how popular it is in the Tamworth region.

Showjumping is being introduced as a new event. These events will be both for regular registered and paint bred horses as well as open breeds. Paint horses are increasingly being seen competing successfully in this non traditional event. We are encouraging local members to showcase their paints in the world of showjumping. Once again we have some major sponsors already lined up for specific events. Garraka Park, are once again sponsoring the weanling Slot Futurity with a guaranteed \$5000

By entering online, you will have the ability to select your own stables and camping areas so there certainly is a benefit to entering on line.

Paint Bred Horses - can only compete in events specified as being for Paint Bred-Horses.

OMEGAFEEDS Simple ingredients - brilliant results.

Yearling Versatility – These events form the Yearling Versatility – Events 103, 109, 118, and 136. The 3 performance events are open to all Regular Registered yearling competitors and are not exclusively for Yearling Versatility entrants. To be considered for the Yearling Versatility award entrants must compete in the halter leg plus at least 2 of the 3 specified performance events and pay an additional Yearling Versatility Nomination of \$25-. Points are calculated as per the High Point System for the National Show across all of these events.

Events 135 and 136 – Yearling Hunter In Hand – Entrants not eligible for classes 137, 138, 139 or 140.

Events 28 to 32 – Hunter Hack – Approved Safety Helmet must be worn in this event and whilst warming up or over practice jump. Events 42 to 49 – Showjumping – Approved Safety Helmet must be worn in this event and whilst warming up or over practice jump. Event 134 – Jackpot All Breeds Reining 3 yrs & over – prior to the commencement of this event a Calcutta will be held.All competitors must participate in the Calcutta to be eligible to compete. The funds raised from the Calcutta will be dispersed at the discretion of the PHAA Board.

Events 33,34,35,36,37,38,39,40 and 41 – Dressage events – Horses may enter a maximum of 3 tests over two consecutive levels only. Approved Safety Helmet must be worn in this event and whilst warming up. Dressage events are run as per EFA rules. 2 Year Old horses are ineligible to enter. The same horse & rider combination must be maintained if the horse competes in different classes. Individual riders may compete on several different horses.

Event 77 – Overo Colour Class & 78 Tobiano Colour Class – Led events, dress and equipment as for halter events. Horse has to be entered in at least one class at the show, to be eligible to compete. Judged 60% on colour, 40% on conformation, coat pattern should have equal distribution of colour and white pattern. Horse must be PHAA registered as Overo or Tobero for Overo class and PHAA registered as Tobiano or Tobero for Tobiano class.

Event 79 – Get of Sire – Three regular registered get, either sex can be shown. Sire must be Regular or Paint Bred Registered with the PHAA, but need not be shown nor get need be owned by owner of sire. Horses actually shown as the Get of Sire will be limited to horses four years old and younger. The progeny of Paint Bred Horses will be eligible to be nominated for Get of Sire Class providing the Paint Bred stallion has one Regular Registered parent.

Events 64, 70 and 76 – APHA Classes – All horses must be registered with the APHA and current owners must be current financial members of the APHA. Competitors and exhibitors for the APHA Gelding Plus Awards must be APHA members and the horse must APHA registered. (details to be supplied)

Events I to I2 – Hack Classes – are open to all horses I4hh and over. Winners of classes 5,6,9,11 and are eligible to compete for Grand Champion Hack. Winners of classes 7, 8 and 10 will be eligible for Grand Champion Paint Bred Hack. Grand Champion Hacks will be a non point scoring events.

LATE ENTRY POLICY – Late entries will be taken at the Show Office up until 5pm the day before the event is to be held, provided there are already a minimum of 2 horses already entered in the event. Flat late penalty fee of \$50- per lodgement plus the normal entry fee, regardless of how many classes are late entered on that day. Example one class \$50- plus \$30-, 2 classes \$50 plus \$60- etc.



BRONZE MEDAL FOR AUSSIE PAINT AT 2010 YOUTH OLYMPICS

Flash Top Hat, an eight year old, 15.3 1/2hh, black overo Paint gelding (Trigger View Top Hat - Elaines Sister, ASBTB) bred by John Samain of Dusty Rivers Stud Traveston QLD, was one of 36 Australian horses selected for the Showjumping events at the 2010 Youth Olympics in Singapore.

The horses were all bought and trained in Australia and provided to the competitors by the Youth Olympic Games organising committee. And for the first time in Olympic history a draw was conducted to ensure a level playing field for the six teams, representing each continent – Africa, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and South America.

With his lovely laid back temperament and 'standout' markings Flash has always been the poster boy of the Glen Haven Park training team, and his prestige was certainly increased during the Youth Olympic Games when he was drawn by Dalma Rushdi H Malhas of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Dalma was the first

ever female athlete from Saudi Arabia to compete in an Olympic event! Dalma was not allowed to ride for the Saudi team and could only compete as an individual, but her bronze medal in the Individual Competition will ensure that both she and her mount will long be remembered. The bond between Flash and Dalma grew each day and their rounds improved in every competition. There were only two riders who jumped clear rounds, without any jumping

faults (penalties), in the finals of the Individual Competition. So great was Dalma and Flash's partnership, that they finished round two with only four faults, and with six other riders also on four penalties, made it into the jump off for bronze, with thrilling results.

The following paragraph was included in the FEI press release which was sent around the world: "As there were six athletes jumping off for the bronze medal, (in the Individual Competition) the excitement was considerable, with riders speeding up and cutting corners in a bid for the fastest time. However, after the dust had settled, it was Dalma Rushdi H Malhas (KSA), riding a tight course for a faultless clear and the



fastest time, on the colourful Australian Paint Horse, Flash Top Hat, who secured the bronze medal. This amazing achievement launched Dalma and Flash into the history books!"

"Flash is the most wonderful ambassador the Paint Horse Association could ever hope for and we're sure that he'll go on to make many new fans in Singapore, where he will now continue to live. We will definitely miss him here at Glen Haven Park, but will always have the memory of the time he graced our lives; and his final scorching round to secure that coveted Olympic bronze medal" said Glen Haven Park Office manager lo lohnson.

Rules changes effective from 1st August, 2010

The following rule changes became effective from 1st August, 2010 and are included in the current PHAA rule Book

Rule 126 - First paragraph amended to read:

Letters are permissible providing that there are no less than two letters. One prefix and it's abbreviation where possible only, is allowed per membership.

Explanation: proposed rule change from BOD meeting February 2010 became effective 01.08.10

Rule 126 - Replace last sentence with the following:

"A prefix may only be used when the person registering the horse is also the breeder of the horse or when written permission is given by the owner of the prefix to the breeder of the said horse."

Explanation: proposed rule change from BOD meeting September 2009 became effective 01.08.10

Rule 225(b) amended to read:

In order to qualify for the award the Yearling must have attained a Register of Merit in each of the 4 events of Halter, Led Trail, Lunge Line and Hunter in Hand, before 31st July of their Yearling year.

Explanation: proposed rule change from BOD meeting September 2009 became effective 01.08.10

Rule 219B deleted

Explanation: proposed rule change from BOD meeting September 2009 became effective 01.08.10

Rules changes effective from 3rd September, 2010

The following rule changes became effective from 3rd September, 2010 and are included in the current PHAA rule Book

Rule 102(b) amended as follows:

- (a) "(i) All horses foaled after July 31, 1979, must have both sire and dam registered in the PHAA Regular Registry, Breeding Stock Registry, AQHA or ASB or a combination of any two of these Associations. A Stallion Service Certificate (breeders certificate) must be furnished with all applications.
- (ii) All horses foaled after July 31, 1999 must have sire or dam registered in the PHAA Regular, Paint Bred or Breeding Stock Registries or with the AQHA or ASB or a combination of any two of these. A Stallion Service Certificate (breeders certificate) must be furnished with all applications. ... etc
- (k) As from 1st August 2009, all 'A' numbered quarter horse stallions which are by a 'Q' numbered horse out of a foundation mare, will only be accepted if the outcross is stud book thoroughbred."

Explanation: Problems regarding wording of Rule 102 had been highlighted. The change recognises changes to Paint Bred and Breeding Stock registries that occurred in 1999 and had not been reflected in the bloodline requirements. Also it clarifies and confirms that 'A' registered QH stallions must be outcrossed to ASB only. Previously this had only been applicable to mares.

Replace Rule 217 (i) with:

"The PHAA shall award Honour Roll and Lifetime points for all Futurities, Maturities and Derbys that do not have a mixed-sex Halter component. Mixed sex halter futurity classes are not approved as point earning classes."

Explanation: Passed as an immediate rule change at September BOD meeting to comply with requirements of Motion E from 2010 AGM. Immediate Rule Change Remove "audited" from Rule 9(f) and replace with "signed". Requirement for balance to be signed off by President and Treasurer of regional club. Amended Rule to read:

(f) "All regional clubs are to provide a signed copy of their balance sheet and provide a copy of annual general meeting minutes

each year to the PHAA as part of their affiliation. Balance Sheet to be signed by President and Treasurer at time of application." Explanation: Regional clubs were having difficulty with providing audited accounts due to different state requirements and problems with obtaining auditors.

Rule 135 be amended to read as follows:

- vi. No horse will be classified as Sabino should they be shown to be positive for the OLWS gene. The PHAA may request proof of a negative OLWS genetic test on any horse prior to allowing classification as 'Sabino'.
- vii. A negative OLWS gene test does not automatically give 'Sabino' classification. Horses that display 'Splashed White' characteristics may be classified as such. Sabino or Splashed White classification will be considered by the PHAA Board of Directors on a case by case basis.

Explanation: Amends this rule to allow for the possibility of OLWS positive thoroughbreds not previously present in Australia.

Proposed Rule changes (to be implemented from 1st August 2011)

Members are invited to comment on the following proposed rule changes which will become effective from 1st August, 2011.

Rule 112 to be amended to ensure DNA of mares is done prior to breeding. New rule 112 to read:

- (a) "All filly foals born from 1st August 1999 must be parentage DNA tested before the filly's progeny can be registered with the PHAA. A veterinarian may attend to collection of the hair sample, or the owner / agent provided the owner / agent completes a statutory declaration in respect of the identification of the filly / mare.
- (b) Fillies / mares will require
- (i) Parentage DNA testing to be complete and on PHAA file prior to being bred. A penalty fee shall apply to mares which are bred without parentage DNA results on file with the PHAA."
- Penalty fee will be added to schedule of fees set at \$100 per mare.

Explanation: This is to protect foal owners to ensure foals can be registered. There have been instances where mares not DNA'ed, have died or the mare owners cannot be contacted, making it difficult to register the foals. Passed at September 2010 BOD meeting

Youth Report



Well, Christmas will soon be here, so I'm hoping all of our Youth have got their orders in for Santa and are looking forward to the school holidays when they can start preparing and training their horses for the up coming shows and also the National Show in early March. Our Youth are a very important part of the PHAA and are our future riders and breeders who promote our special and unique horses. The Youth division is usually split into two main groups; Junior and Senior. Junior Youth age is up to

13 years old and Senior Youth is 14 years to 18 years. The earliest age for competing is 2 years and there are usually Leadline and Walk-Trot(Jog) classes for Youth aged 2 to 10 years. (Youth age is calculated as their 'age' on the 1st of August. Not their actual birth date.)

AWARDS AND REWARDS!

Each year the PHAA rewards members with a series of awards earned by accumulating show points. Points are recorded on a one-horse-one-rider basis, so if you ride more than one horse the points will be kept separate, not totalled.

There are awards for the High Point Youth of Australia each year, as well as the High Point Youth of each State, the Top 10 Youth overall and a Youth Encouragement Award. Throughout the time of your membership you can accumulate points for various 'Lifetime' Youth Awards – such as Register Of Merit in your favourite events. Further awards are attained as you earn more points, through Superior to Century Awards as well as other awards that are earned in a combination of events. Many types of competition are recognized, including Western Performance shows, Dressage, Eventing, Show Jumping, Agricultural Shows, Pony Club, Hacking and other events.

(Details about awards can be found in the PHAA Rule Book)

YOUTH TEAM - APHA World Show

Every second year since 2000, the PHAA has taken a team of our most competitive Youth members to compete at the APHA World Championship Show in Fort Worth, Texas USA. Our teams have performed very well and have been great ambassadors for Australia and the Association. This is the chance of a lifetime for most young Paint owners, not only competing at the highest level but also representing the Youth of Australia. The Youth team members learn a lot about Paint Horses as well as seeing first hand the techniques and methods utilised by our American counterparts. Teams come from many countries to compete in the Youth World Games – Youth Team members have the chance to meet other Youth and make friends from all over the world!

A visit to the American Paint Horse Association (APHA) headquarters is included, visits to ranches or trainers are organised and of course shopping at some of the best tack stores in the USA! Part of the Team selection process is an accumulation of show points over a two year period.

CLINICS AND CAMPS

The PHAA encourages our affiliated clubs to hold camps and clinics specifically for our Youth members. The PHAA held its inaugural Youth Camp at Grafton in 2005. These camps are a good way to learn more about showing and getting to meet other members your own age.

As you can see there are plenty of good reasons to be a part of the PHAA and to be a PHAA Youth competitor.

YOUTH GOODS AND SERVICES AUCTION

The Youth Goods & Services Auction at the National Show is a big fund-raiser for the Youth of the PHAA and we are seeking interest from members of the Association to help out with donations of goods and services for this event. If you have any items or have contacts who may be able to help out supplying goods or services, please contact me (YOUTH EMAIL) to arrange details as we would love to see the kids get a heap of money back in the bank account so we can get them over to the USA again and also to help support our Youth Camps and events for them here in Australia. This night is one of the highlights of the National Show. We are also looking for other fundraising events and ideas to run during the Nationals to help raise money for the kids as well.

HSAA Report

Welcome to the first PHAA Journal report from the HSAA in some time!

As many older PHAA Members know, but new members may not, the "Horse Show Association of Australia" is the association responsible for the Performance Rule Book and training and accrediting Judges. It is the main association in the Western industry other than the AQHA with a fully comprehensive performance Rule book. It is not breed specific and offers all affiliates access to qualified Judges, Insurance requirements and a comprehensive performance rule book.

The Paint Horse Association is an affiliate of the HSAA. This means all approved shows are run under HSAA rules. However in certain circumstances PHAA rules will over-ride HSAA rules. An example is the Amateur Owner rule (this does differ between breeds). However most other performance events are clearly covered by the HSAA Rule book unless clearly noted by the PHAA on the relevant programs or stated in the HSAA rule book. The HSAA does not cover breed standards and halter rules as these are breed specific. Rule books are available from the HSAA (contact Lynda Gray 07 5429 8797) and information can also be accessed via the website, i.e. www.horseshowassociationofaustralia.org.au It is a good idea for all competitors to have an up to date rule book. It will help to have a better understanding of what is required for each event. It is invaluable to all members.

Rule changes come into effect at the 1st August each year. All rule changes go through a process of "proposed rule changes" which are printed in the newsletters and distributed to all affiliate clubs for feedback. We welcome feedback! Once discussion has occurred rules then go to the committee again to be put forward to be implemented. All updated rule changes are now available, and can be inserted in your rule book and includes a current list of affiliates and Judges.

The HSAA is always working to expand the list of HSAA qualified Judges, but HSAA Judging seminars (and information nights) can

also be highly recommended as a way to increase a competitors' knowledge of the various events, and to learn what is expected in the classes and what judges are looking for.

Upcoming events for the HSAA include an information night covering the Rule Book, insurance issues, steward training and other educational information to be held in 17th December at Caboolture Show Grounds. A Judging Seminar to be held 15th & 16th January at Caboolture Show Grounds. This is for Applicant Judges, interested competitors and refresher Judges and anyone who has an interest in showing. WHAT IS THE POINT OF POINTS?

People who are new to the 'Western' scene are often rather confused or mystified by the emphasis placed on 'chasing points'. After all, they say, we get ribbons, trophies, and sometimes even prize money, so why bother with the sometimes tedious business of checking class numbers, writing out the points sheets and getting them signed etc, etc. Well, first and foremost, your Points Book is a permanent record of what you won, where, and against how many. Ribbons, sashes, garlands and trophies are all wonderful to win, and they make a great display but don't provide much, if any, information.

REWARDS

The rewards for submitting your points sheets far outweigh the slight inconvenience of keeping track of the class numbers and placings. You have permanent record of all your placing and the number of horses in each class at every show attended, and there are certificates to be earned at various levels for both annual points and lifetime accumulations of points. These certificates are a permanent reminder of achievements, and also greatly increase the value of a horse for sale, the value of progeny, and particularly the value of a stallion standing at stud.

The PHAA compiles an annual High Point list, known as the Honour Roll, which is divided up into sex and age divisions for the Halter classes, and age and event categories for the Performance classes. The Honour Roll at present is split up into several divisions, which include; Regular Registry Halter & Regular Registry Performance; Paint Bred (solid) Registry Halter & PB Performance; also sections for Amateur Owner

Regular Registered horses and Paint Breds; and Youth Honour Rolls for Regular Registry and Paint Bred horses. At the end of each 'points year' certificates are issued for the winner and runner up in each event category, and the overall High Point winners in Halter and Performance are awarded certificates and trophies. The events that PHAA members can claim points for cover every discipline within the Western and non-Western show scene. Basically, if there is an event at a show, gymkana, campdraft, rodeo, or Pony Club competition, the PHAA has a category somewhere in the Honour Roll for it. The points are allocated on a sliding scale according to how many horses in the class, so that a horse that beats a lot of others is rewarded with more points than the horse that only beats I or 2. Updates of the Honour Roll are published periodically in the Paint Horse Journal, and on the PHAA website.

AWARDS

The PHAA also has in place a series of Award Certificates, which are awarded when a horse achieves a certain number of points in an event, these points can be accumulated over the lifetime of the horse and are tabulated on each separate event, IE: Halter, Trail, Hacking etc. The 'entry' level award is a Register of Merit

In classes with more than 100 entries, this scale is to be continued in increments for each 10 extra horses

(or ROM), which is awarded when a horse (or Youth or Amateur Owner) earns 10 points in an event. After the ROM there is the Distinction (25 points), Superior (50 points), then Bronze Century (100), Silver Century (200), and Gold Century (300) awards. There are also some 'accumulative' awards, which cover more than one event; the PHAA Champion award, the Superior All-Round Horse award and the PHAA Supreme Champion award. Full details can be found in the Rules page on the PHAA website. www.painthorse.com.au

'PETROL POINTS'

One of the main aims of the Paint Horse Association is the promotion of the Paint Horse and the Honour Roll is in place to publicly acknowledge the efforts of Members. Sometimes people have complained that the Honour Roll is based on 'petrol points', biased towards the members who can afford to get their horses out to a lot of shows and can attend the 'big' shows like State and Nationals etc. This is possibly a valid observation, but they are missing the point in that the Honour Roll is in place to reward Members for their promotion of the Paint Horse. Another observation has been made that the inclusion of classes that quite often have very large entries, makes it hard for competitors in the traditional Western classes, with their smaller class sizes, to actively compete for the overall High Point Awards. What has to be remembered is that competing in a discipline that often has classes with huge numbers is certainly no guarantee of easy points – the Paint horse has to be good enough to beat 30 or 40 or 50 other horses to earn those big points! Just being able to afford to haul long distances is certainly no guarantee of success.

TOO MUCH BOTHER?

It does seem like a lot of bother when you first start filling in your points book, but once you get into a routine it is not so difficult. It does help if you can have a family member or friend jotting everything down, but it's not so hard to have the show program and pen on a clipboard so that you can just ride up to your float and jot down the details against the relevant class (IE: 1 st out of seven horses would be simply 1-7 against the class on the program). The main thing to note, as well as your placing, is the number in the class, so make sure you get into the habit of counting how many are in the class (including yourself) when the class commences. It can often be too late after you have placed because some of the class may have been dismissed before a final workout! At the end of the day, or whenever you get a break, just transfer the information into the points book (IE:"Event" Hack NE 16hh: "Placing" I; "No in class" 7). It can be handy to have a copy of the point score system glued onto the cover of your points book for easy reference, but if you are not sure about a class write the details into your book anyhow; the PHAA office staff will sort it out and they would much rather you didn't diddle yourself out of points. Before you go home you need to get the Judge, Show Secretary or a Ring Steward to sign your points book. Then you simply mail the front sheet and a copy of the show program to the PHAA office within 30 days. Sounds like a lot of bother maybe, but why not get the maximum available benefit from your entry money? Not to mention the dollars and time that go into feeding, training and hauling that show horse around.

The PHAA does not charge for the recording of your points or the certificates, and the benefits to the owner, breeder, and even the trainer, are surely worth a few postage stamps and a few minutes of your time. You may even save the sanity of the owner of your horse's sire ... stallion owners rely heavily on having progeny out there promoting their stallion, and they can be driven to despair by having horses doing well but not getting their points recorded and their achievements acknowledged.

And after a halter career beginning in 1978 and starting under saddle in 1979, little was it imagined that at the amazing old age of 33 years (or more uniquely in his fifth show calendar decade) he would still be saddled up and competing, albeit on a greatly reduced scale when compared with earlier days.

JANS BOY, THE HORSE WHO

Originally purchased by Steve O'Connor to use as a working station horse, he has combined this with a varied and successful show career as well as being an integral part of the O'Connor families' life. He has been used as a stock horse in the main and at times has returned to active showing after numerous retirements! Mustering, scrubber running, droving, weaner tailing, campdrafting, pony club, hacking, dressage, all sorts of western (just don't mention Trail Classes!) and plain old boundary riding have ensured Boy has enjoyed a varied and long life.

Since 2005 the pace has greatly lessened and he is currently back on "Toorak" a 36,000 ha property that ran upwards of 2000 breeders (cattle) and 5000 sheep in NW Queensland and which has been his home base on and off since 1996. Prior to that it was on a 40,000 ha cattle and sheep station near Winton and another few years from 2004 was spent on the 36,000 ha of "Swans Lagoon" on the mighty Burdekin River, where the O'Connor kids had to refrain from swimming their horses in the lagoons because of the numbers of laughing logs (crocs) around!

There are not too many ridden events this PHAA Superior All Round Horse has not competed in, with several PHAA High Point Horse awards, National and State Championships. Most importantly is the affection and trust in which he is held by his "family". All the O'Connor children, numerous cousins, visitors and nervous first timers have learnt the fundamentals of horsemanship on this easygoing gentleman.

Steve O'Connor, his owner since purchasing him from Jack and the late Agnes Stewart of Highview Paints as a yearling in 1978, stated, "I told Jack I was after a big strong boned horse that would go the distance, and has he ever! Four generations of my family have ridden Boy, from my then 83 yo grandfather in the 1980's, my father, wife and children through to my nieces and nephews! In all truth it's the horse that deserves any accolades, all I've had is the pleasure of riding him (I cannot say I own him, I reckon its the other way about!) and having arrived on the infant western riding scene very much a typical ringer, then by any measure the accolades for his later achievements should go to those who mentored both he and I at that time."

"Being trained and ridden by horsemen of the calibre of Vic Gough, the late Marv Kildey, Rhonda McCallum to name a few, has made him the horse he is. This is not forgetting all those against whom I competed and who deserve recognition for their efforts in helping Boy achieve what he has done. However it is to my wife Carol, children Matt, Jomi, Teagan and Leah who have at times, no doubt, often wondered who came first, Boy or them, that all my thanks are directed", says Steve. Never a model halter type (it took 15 years to earn his Superior in Halter) Boy none the less has given his all regardless of the event or job at hand. At the 1982 Nationals the American judge Ernest Wilson remarked, "He may be ugly, but boy can he ride!"

A formidable competitor in Western Riding and Rope Races in the past, he has won numerous State and National Titles in these events, at both Open and Youth level, and was willingly loaned to others when required, to compete in any event, winning several National Titles along the way. In between all this fun he has had to earn his keep in the (station) plant as do all the O'Connor horses.

"In the mid 80's to the 90's it was not uncommon to get huge numbers in a class requiring go rounds and this intense compe-



tition made for a real sense of camaraderie at not only Ag and Club shows but State and National events. You also rode the same horse in every event, up to 13 at one State Show I recall. Things might have been a bit more casual then but I also think people got a greater sense of enjoyment out of these events due to this versatility when compared with the present. Nowadays drinking rum at a mates campfire until 5am is probably not the best way to start showing at 8am but then we were all on equal (if not wobbly) terms. We certainly were relaxed! Probably why I drifted away from Western showing and only resumed at Pony Club and Gymkhanas' when my children started to ride. And the fact home was 3 and half hours SE of Mt Isa!''

Boy 'finished' his part time campdrafting career in 2004 and was again returned to the pensioner paddock being used as a learner "pony", weaner tailing and occasionally at Pony Club. He even won a Zone Dressage event during this hiatus. Ridden by Steve's daughter Leah O'Connor he also featured in a "Trade Queensland" advertisement made by the Queensland Government for overseas use in 2007. Another publication to feature him was the 2000 Year of The Outback School of The Air Calendar.

Steve says, "I kept putting him out, but whenever we loaded the truck or float up, he would march up ready to go, so I banged on a set of shoes and yet again we hit the road so to speak." As result of this in mid 2009, after veterinary checks and approval, he was returned to Pony Club. This marked his return to part time riding yet again and was done in part to demonstrate his past mastery of the flying change.

Remarkably in July 2010, as a young-at-heart 33year old he was shown yet again and won the Senior Ridden Stockman's turnout

and then backed up to win the Senior Western Riding, his pet event, in a field of 5. He may yet have another few rides, but while he was being clipped for this last show, Steve swears Boy looked around at the sound of the clippers and said, "Here we go again!"

The reason for his longevity? Plenty of work, TLC, regular dental care and for the past 6 years and ad lib mix of copra meal, DCP, vegetable oil and molasses keeps him going. His only concession is being rugged every winter. After a lifetime of work and competition in every mainland state and Territory, Boy is still relaxed and canters up from his Mitchell grassed paddock each evening when called for his evening feed. "His is the kind of retirement we'd all want, still capable and needed. A real mate."

As Will Ogilvie said, truly "The Pearl Of Them All"



REGISTERING YOUR HORSE ... NOT QUITE AS COMPLICATED AS IT APPEARS

At first sight the PHAA registration application forms look complicated, as there is a lot of information that must be supplied before a horse's registration can be processed and completed. This article will take you step by step through the process and (hopefully) assist you in filling out your forms correctly to ensure that there are no holdups in the process. If you need more detailed information, the PHAA Rule Book is available online on the PHAA website – simply look up the "Rules and Regulations of Registration" section.

There are some hard-and-fast rules regarding registering of foals:

- You must be a PHAA Member to register a Paint Horse
- Stallions must be upgraded with the parentage DNA on file PRIOR TO BREEDING
- Quarter Horse or Thoroughbred stallions must be listed with the PHAA
- Mares born after 1st of August 1999 must have their DNA on file PRIOR to the foal being registered. As from 1st August 2011, mares will also be required to be parentage DNA tested before being bred.

REGISTERED NAME

The first section on the form is for the 'Registered' name you want for the horse: You can enter three choices to ensure that if your first choice is already taken, there are alternates. Names are limited to a maximum of 25 letters and spaces, including a stud prefix. Stud prefixes are reserved for the exclusive use of the person who registered the prefix.

WHICH REGISTRY?

The 'Registry' section is where things get a little complicated but the table below will help you to work out just which 'box' you should tick. (This table can also assist you in making informed decisions regarding your breeding program in the future). The PHAA has three main Registries –

• Regular Registry: for 'coloured' horses that meet the minimum colour requirements (see rule 103); these horses have breeding and showing rights.

- Paint Bred Registry: for 'solid' horses that do not meet the minimum colour requirements (see Rule 108); these horses also have breeding and showing rights.
- Breeding Stock Registry: for 'solid' horses that do not qualify for Regular or Paint Bred registration (see Rule 109); breeding rights only – no showing rights.

COLOURS

The section for coat colour has 22 'boxes' for you to choose from. Some colours are easy to work out, and some are more complicated, but quite often a look at the colour of the parents may clarify matters. A couple of years ago this selection was expanded to include newly recognised colours such as Silver, Pearl and Champagne. All of the colours listed are possible Paint Horse colours although some are relatively rare. Some basics to keep in mind that may help you are:

- Chestnut (red) parents can only produce a chestnut foal.
- A grey must have at least one grey parent and are never born grey, (it is important that the birth, or 'base' colour of a grey foal is noted).

- A palomino or buckskin must have at least one creme gene parent. The gene cannot be hidden and reappear in later generations.
- A dun or red dun foal must have at least one dun gene parent.

If you are unsure of the 'correct' colour of your foal, attach a note to your application asking for clarification.

COAT PATTERNS

There are six main coat patterns recognised for the registration of Paints, including 'solid' which may or may not be 'hiding' one of the other patterns.

The coat patterns of Paint horses can vary enormously and no two horses will ever show exactly the same markings. There are several different colour genes that affect the coat markings, and currently there are gene tests for only some of them. This can sometimes make it hard to identify just which 'coat-pattern' gene (or combination) is present.

OVERO – or 'frame' overo (OLWS). A coloured horse will automatically be classified as Overo (or Tobero) if it has an overo

parent. If it has a gene test to show that it is OLWS negative, you can apply to have it reclassified as Sabino or Splashed White. The PHAA discourages the breeding of two OLWS positive horses due to the one in four possibility of a 'Lethal White' foal. Responsible breeders should determine the OLWS status of the sire and dam prior to breeding to avoid this possibility.

TOBIANO – A Tobiano must have one tobiano parent and is usually fairly easily identified by its markings. There is a colour DNA test available for Tobiano.

SABINO – Sabino usually shows long hind leg stockings and occasionally belly patches. There may also be socks and half cannon front leg markings. There are thought to be several genes responsible for Sabino markings but only one of them has been genetically identified. So a negative Sabino DNA test (Sb1) does not mean your horse cannot be registered as Sabino. Parentage will be considered when a horse is considered for Sabino classification

TOBERO – Horses that have both Tobiano and Overo (OLWS) in their background will usually show a pattern which is characteristic to the gene mix. The presence or absebce of both genes can be determined by a colour DNA test

SPLASHED WHITE – This pattern is more common in Australia than it used to be. It is characterised by the horse looking like it has 'walked through a tub of white paint' with its head down. Minimal forms are characterised by even high stockings on all legs (not speared as with Sabino) - particularly on the front legs and a 'dipped' bald or bonnet face with the white extending up underneath the jaw. When extended on to the body, the white will go from the 'bottom up'. Extreme or maximum Splashed White horses may have a predisposition to hearing problems, thought to do with a lack of pigment in the inner ear. As yet there is no gene test for splashed white, so classification in on appearance and parentage.

SOLID – These are horses which do not meet the minimum colour requirements

for Paint Horses. That is, the white on their bodies does not extend past certain specific points. Sometimes it is so close that inspection may be required to determine the status of the horse. Solid horses can carry any of the above colour genes but still are classified as 'Solid'

There are many illustrations in the Rulebook to help you identify your horse's markings and also details of the minimum required size of the markings and where they must be located for the horse to pass for Paint registration.

In the same way that you can mix a cake and adding one ingredient or another to a basic mixture will change the appearance and taste of the finished cake; so it is with Paint Horses. They may have one or more 'pattern' genes that can combine and influence and alter the coat markings.

DNATESTING

There are now many different Genetic Tests available and some confusion exists regarding what and where they can be done.

- Parentage DNA (used to be called 'DNA Typing): compulsory before using any Paint for breeding purposes. It can only be done through the PHAA, with fees pre-paid and sent with the PHAA genetest application form'.
- Coat Colour and White Pattern Genetic Testing; this test can be done through the PHAA, at the time of registration or may be done separately through other accredited laboratories. Tests are available for many coat colours including black, cream, dun, Pearl and Champagne. The PHAA recommends that OLWS testing is done for all breeding horses with Overo bloodlines – especially solids.
- Genetic Conditions such as HYPP and HERDA – HERDA is a genetic condition only found in horses with Poco Bueno bloodlines and the PHAA encourages Members to test these horses. HYPP horses are not eligible for registration with the PHAA

PHOTOS

The PHAA requires four (4) recent photos with the registration application, consisting of one of each side; one front and one back. Have the horse clean and if possible have someone hold the horse and pose it for you, because for all of the photos the horse needs to be stood up so all four legs are visible (see samples). Put the mane over to the far side so neck markings aren't hidden, and try for a reasonably clear background with the sun behind you. For the side photos stand at a right angles to the horses flank area, for the front and back you will need to be slightly off-centre so all four legs are visible.

If the horse is a light colour you may need to wet the skin to show up the white markings. If so, take the photos on a cloudy day so the glare doesn't reflect off the coat. If a horse only has minimal markings you will need to take close-ups of the white area, with a ruler held beside it for an indication of the size (refer to rule 103), and you may even need to shave the area if the pink skin underneath is not visible after wetting.

Only good quality 6" by 4" (15cm x 10cm) photos are acceptable or you may send them in a medium resolution jpeg file. Digital photos may be emailed to registrations@painthorse.com.au

All that remains now is to fill out the rest of pages one and two:You need to:

- Calculate and include fees,
- Attach the original PINK copy of the service certificate (photocopies are not acceptable)
- If you are not the owner of the dam, make sure the registered owner at the time of birth of the foal signs the form as well

Double and triple-check that you have included all the relevant paperwork and fees, and post it all off to the PHAA office. If you have any questions, just ask.

The truth, however, was that she was inoperable as a result of foaling complications, and had we not picked up on what was happening she soon would have been in incredible pain. The fact that she did not suffer gave us great consolation.

Skippy normally would foal like clockwork and without incident, five days short of a year. This year would be the exception as the weather was woeful in Victoria and despite foaling in a nice dry large stable she hung on to the foal for one year and four days. After the initial signs of foaling she went into inertia. It took both the vet and I all our strength to get the foal out as he was so big. Although it didn't go great and there were initial concerns we were supposed to be home and hosed if she made it to lunch time. She did and for the next two days I had the vet out to Skippy at least twice a day and every time the result was the same, heart rate good, temperature good, gut sounds good. So why was it then that as I watched her on the CCTV all night that she just didn't look right? She just wasn't acting like her normal I'm starving, give me some more food now, pooping machine self! She just would stand there with her bum in the corner of the stable, resting one back leg, then the other.

After two days of this behaviour, the local vet finally agreed that she wasn't right as her heart rate went up and off we went to surgery.

Inside the clinic prior to the surgery it seemed like there were vets everywhere so I felt a little awkward when I was hugging Skip, just praying for a good result. Even up to the last minute prior to surgery as she stood quietly in the crush getting scanned, all she was worried about was her baby foal, only two days old. When we left the vet that night and got in the truck to drive home I felt like I couldn't breathe and was physically ill. By the next morning the river of tears that had flowed that night had taken its toll on me and I had broken out in hives.

> The next day I went back to the clinic to pick up the foal and was presented with a plaited section of Skippy's tail and her forelock which just killed me inside. I was crying, the receptionist was crying and basically anyone who was unfortunate enough to come into contact with me did too. The vet was very mindful, explaining the whole situation in detail and was careful to say that the damage was done during the delivery because the foal was so big and was inoperable from the minute she gave birth. Somehow, it still didn't make me feel any better.

Life can be so cruel sometimes. While we were still reeling from the loss of our beautiful Skipastaray two days later, Sandy (Legally Blond) foaled our much prayed for buckskin filly (by Sir Cool Mister) on Saturday morning ... stillborn. All I could think of was that this was supposed to be a happy ending to a tragic week, but that was not to be. I picked myself up from crying on the stable floor and Van removed Sandy's stillborn buckskin filly, I brought in Skippy's foal (who I'd been bucket feeding) covered in the smell of Sandy's foal and she has accepted him as her own without hesitation. More tears. A needle sized miracle in a haystack of tragedy. Sandy and Skippy were best friends and I guess that is what best mates do for each other. We have renamed Skippy's foal ... Lucky.

In trying to fathom why Skippy had such an impact on me, it really wasn't about all the shows that we'd been to and her success in both Australia and the U.S., it wasn't that we'd owned her for a long time in two countries and brought her half way around the world, it wasn't that she's produced the awesome foals that she has, it was just because Skippy was Skippy. She was the most no fuss, beautiful and trustworthy horse I'd ever been around in my life. Everyone that came into contact with her loved her.

Her original breeder and only other owner Tena Adams post on FaceBook summed up Skippy perfectly:

Just remembering the morning she was born. She was such a gorgeous foal. She was always just gorgeous, in the field, on the rail, or standing Grand for the day. Your loss is ours as well. We have been so proud of her and appreciative of the loving home you have given her. Thank you Sue and Van for giving her such a good life and loving her so much. Love and condolences across the seas my friends. Tena

And from Tena's daughter Mollie:

So tragic to lose such a beautiful mare! I was fortunate enough to show Skip for several years, and I will never forget them. Skippy helped build the confidence I needed to take her full younger brother to outstanding accomplishments (multiple World Champion). That particular choice of bloodlines was simply remarkable! Skippy was an absolute knock-out any age! So sorry for your loss Sue. Much Love, Mollie

As I write this article it is now two and a half months later, the tears are still flowing as I relive this tragedy. It has taken me a week of waking up in the middle of the night teary to build up the guts to put this together. Thanks to my husband Van who has been so supportive throughout this terrible ordeal and to Di White who dropped everything that day to come with me to the surgery when I badly needed some moral support.

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READY FOR THE ROAD

With the show season getting into full swing, horse owners all over the country will be busy preparing their horses – feeding, grooming, exercising, training etc. Many of these horses will be babies, receiving their introduction to travelling and the whole show scene. If we are careful, these babies will be able to spend the next 20 years of their lives entering floats calmly and with complete confidence. But once a horse has been turned into a 'bad floater' or a 'scrambler' a lifetime may not be long enough to change his attitude to travelling!

It may sound simplistic, but having horses that are good travellers starts with your horse float. For your mature horses, first make sure it is big enough! Sounds pretty basic, doesn't it? But our horses are getting bigger and bulkier every year, and a 16hh- plus Halter horse or Hunter Under Saddle horse needs a lot more room than the horses of five to ten years ago. The horse must have enough room to stretch his head and neck forward, and he should be able to lift his head up without banging it on the roof. He shouldn't be jammed in lengthwise either, he needs to be able to lean his body forward or back on hills and turns, and the same applies to the width of the bay, he needs enough room to be able to balance his weight without having to shuffle his feet around all the time. Full length, solid partitions are usually not a good idea, the horse needs to be able to spread his legs for balance, and if they cant they will quite often panic and start scrambling.

ROADWORTHY INSPECTION

At least once a year, and certainly before any long trip, your float should receive a thorough 'roadworthy'. Check the braking system, wheel bearings, and tyres (inside walls too). Check the sub-frame carefully for rust or cracks, and pull up the floor mats and check the entire floor to make sure it is sound, (make sure that you refasten the mats securely). Many horses have been terribly maimed by having a foot going though the floor when they are travelling.

Once you have established that your float is 'roadworthy', now check that it is 'horseworthy'. It is against the law in most states for a person to ride inside a float on a public road, so for the next part of your checkup you may have to 'borrow' a farm track somewhere. Go for a short ride inside your horse float. What does it sound like in there? Imagine if you had to listen to that squeak or rattle for hundreds or thousands of kilometres – how relaxed would you be when you got to your destination, and how keen would you be to repeat the trip? Quite often all that is needed is a dob of



poor horse scrambling for his footing behind you? All changes of pace and direction need to be executed smoothly and steadily; ease your rig into a stop at intersections and when turning a corner. Roundabouts

grease, some silicon or perhaps a piece of rubber needs to be fixed between two sections of metal that are banging or rubbing together (old car or truck innertubes can be had for nothing and can easily be renewed as required).

Researchers over the years have found that horses travel best on a forty-five degree angle, (and this may surprise you), most of them ride better with their tail ends forward! In trials where horses have been turned loose in trucks or trailers and observed whilst travelling, nine out of ten horses placed themselves on an angle, and most of them faced the back corner on the passenger side of the vehicle IE: butts to the driver's side front. If you are considering buying a new float look into the angle load models as they are far better for horses to travel in. And if you happen to be having a gooseneck made give some thought to getting the inside dividers configured for 'butt to the front' angling.

BAD TRAVELLERS = BAD DRIVERS

Bad travellers are nearly always made by bad drivers! But conversely, good smooth driving can make a huge difference to how their horses view floats and travelling. When you are driving with horse on board you have to think and look ahead much, much further than normally. Sure, that fancy electric braking system allows you to 'stop on a dime', but what about your and turns at intersection should be driven at human walking pace – come into them steadily and make sure that the float has straightened up completely before accelerating.

If possible you should never brake or accelerate unless the float is perfectly straight behind your towing vehicle. If you ad centrifugal force to braking or acceleration, you are mixing a recipe for a scrambler. If you have to travel on a steep, twisting mountain road – crawl! Better to upset a few fellow road users, (let them pass whenever possible) than to have to cope with a scrambler for years!

A lot of people don't realize that a relaxed, confident traveller will actually sleep while travelling, so it is a good idea to get into the habit of gently rocking your brakes to wake your horse/s up to warn them of possible changes in the float's motion, particularly if you are coming into a town or heavier traffic.

DRIVING TEST

If you are really serious about floating your horses, it is a good idea to periodically give yourself a driving test; particularly if one of your horses begins to show a dislike of your float. Load a horse into your float and go for a ten to fifteen kilometre trip (not on a nice straight freeway). Leave the top section of the back of the float open and have someone follow you and observe your horse as you turn corners, brake for intersections etc. (passengers operating CB radios or mobile phones can provide instant feedback). It can be a real eye-opener to discover just how difficult it can be for your horse to keep his balance while travelling; and you might just get a bit of a shock as to how hard you have been making your horse's trip! If your horses normally get a smooth ride from you they will usually forgive the occasional lapse, but continual rough trips will soon sour them.

When you are introducing a baby to the joys of travelling, don't leave it until show day to start. And remember, "The longer you take the quicker he will load" - take

your time! If possible back the float into a yard gateway so he cant leave the country. Sometimes it can help if you sit on the tailgate with the feed bucket between your legs and just wait and let him check it all out, just skid yourself back as he decides to see what you are up too and he will be loading before you know it. Remember he also needs to know how to back up on command too so that needs to be included in this practice, a step or two at a time whether forward or back. Load him on and off the float several times before you even consider taking him for a ride. Give him some feed in there and make it a 'nice place', and then have a nice quiet travelling companion in there with him and take them for a little crawl around the block. Repeat this formula a few times before taking him on a trip and he will be well on the way to being a lifetime good traveller.

LONG DISTANCES

On long trips the horse should be offloaded every three to four hours and walked around for a few minutes. A lot of horses wont urinate on a float and can get very



uncomfortable. Offer him some water from his own bucket, but it is not a good idea to let him pick at the grass - you don't know what might have been sprayed on it before you got there! When you get to your destination, walk him around for a while to unlock his kinks and then it is a good idea to put his feed and water containers down on the ground for the first night - putting his head down to eat and drink will help drain his sinuses and ease any travel sickness.

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WANTED DEAD OR ALIVE

You have a horse that is hard to catch, a foal that you are halter training, or a hood that needs a halter over it to hold it in place, and it makes so much sense to leave the halter on; you have checked the paddock or yard to make sure there is nothing that could catch on the halter, so you feel safe in leaving the halter on and your life is so much easier.

Most people don't realize just what a dangerous piece of equipment a halter can be, however. A halter can snag on a onecentimetre protrusion and it is a very rare horse that will just stand and wait for help when they are unexpectedly attacked by a gate, tree, or tap, let alone a hind foot that is suddenly locked to their head! Horses are a prey animal and you can never completely over-ride millions of years of instinct which has taught them that the way to survive attack is to flee. Even a quiet older horse may panic under these circumstances.

The 'western' rope halters are particularly dangerous as they are made not to break, and the rope used is not only strong but is also quite a small diameter. This concentrates the pressure over the poll behind the ears, and can cause extreme pain if there is several hundred kilos of horse trying to escape whatever is attacking it. Never ever leave one of these rope halters on a horse unless you are standing beside it!

The following instances are just a few examples of what has happened when halters were left on.

- A Quarter Horse foal with a training halter left on to make it easier to catch her for handling. She managed to get a hind foot caught in the side of the halter when scratching and broke two legs in her struggles. Cause of death – euthanized when the vet arrived an hour later.
- A lovely show mare turned out for exercise. The inside heel of the shoe on her hind foot caught on the cheek-piece of her halter and she crashed down the side of a hill. Cause of death – broken neck.
- A lovely Paint foal at a show for a Weanling Futurity. The halter was left on to stop the hood from dislodging. The foal was found in the morning hanging from

the stall gate, with the underneath of the halter caught on the 5cm knob of the sliding bolt on the outside of the gate. Cause of death – shock after severe trauma to front legs.

• A two-year old Appaloosa gelding, a little hard to catch sometimes; turned out for a run in the arena. He reached over the rails at the end of the arena to scratch his chin and the halter caught on the end of the top rail. Cause of death – broken neck.

By far a better alternative is to practice a lot of 'catch-and-release' with your horse. Don't expect him to want to be caught if the only time you catch him is for work or shove a drench down his throat. Make being 'officially' caught a part of his daily routine. "You-no-catching-me" means his feed walks away and doesn't come back

til the next day (if necessary). Start out by demanding a touch on the neck in exchange for the feed, then extend that demand to getting touched and rubbed around the neck and face, then he must have a halter put on before he gets the feed. Once the horse gives in, you put the halter on



pat him and then just remove it again. A bit of time spent in establishing the rules can save a lot of problems down the track, particularly with a youngster

If you absolutely have to leave something on a horses head, you can purchase 'breakaway' halters which have a weak spot built in; or alternatively, use a 'thoroughbred' neck strap, which also has a built in breakaway buckle tongue. You can make your own breakaway neck strap from an old webbing halter. Cut off the cheek straps and noseband (shadowed), leaving the jowl to chin under-jaw strap and the straps that normally go under the jowl and over the poll. If possible use bolt cutters on the ring under the chin and just thread a short length of plaited string through the loop

where the ring was. Do the 'neck-strap' up fairly snugly around the horses neck, just behind the ears, and DO NOT put the end of the

strap back thru the buckle. This will provide an additional weak point because if the horse does get caught up the buckle-tongue will give way quite easily. Anything else left on a horse is simply an accident waiting to happen.

You may think you are wasting a lot of time trying to catch a recalcitrant horse, but remember – he will be easy to catch if he is dead!
