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- WEIGHTED TAILS -

To the members:

Following representation prior to the National Show it was decided to postpone the introduction of the weight limit on false tails until 01 August 2015. At the time it was stated that the Board would call for submissions re the upper limit to be introduced.


The Board has agreed (by majority decision vote of 7 for and I against) that the maximum weight for a false tail will be one kilogram, and increase from the initial 500 gram limit set.

There was some discussion re the enforcing of the new limit, but, as with the majority of the show and contest rules, they are selfregulating. We rely on the competitor to abide by the completion rules and as with all regulations that are knowingly breached, they would be dealt with as laid down in the show and competition rules.

Well the new show year is upon us, foaling season is here and lots are anxiously awaiting news on pregnancies after having spent hours choosing the right stallion for their mares. Welcome to the world of being an Amateur Owner.

And what a great year it was last year for our Association. We had record numbers at our National Show, just a handful of entries shy of Q15; a remarkable effort considering the size of our breed organibabamoth that is the AOHA

sation compared to the behemoth that is the AQHA.

The Ranch Riding Classes really shone this year, growing in size to warrant two full days of competition and we can only expect them to grow more now that the Quarter Horse people have realised how much fun they are.

My next big project for the coming months is to get the PHAA to re-introduce the Novice Amateur status, allowing our less experienced Amateur riders to compete at the bigger shows without the pressures of riding against the big names. So stay tuned as I twist the arms of the rest of the BOD to get this in ASAP.

Another project I am quietly working on is to develop a proposal for the American Paint Horse Association to start-up an Amateur Exchange Program. I envisage the exchange will be run every two years, with the Americans competing at our National Show every four years and our team at their National Show two years apart. I first broached this idea with the APHA at Tamworth and it has been met with enthusiasm by all their industry leaders. Eventually I hope to make it as successful as the Youth World Cup teams and would love to see other countries join in the spirit of amateur competition.

On the subject of showing, I feel it is pertinent to remind people to treat others with the respect they would like to be afforded, given the amount of complaints that have recently been sent to the office. Really, we don't expect everyone to be BFFs but it doesn't take much to at least be polite and courteous to fellow competitors, judges and stewards.

This season I would love to see more clubs take advantage of the Amateur and Youth Clinic payments, which makes those valuable events much more affordable for those that attend. Rule Changes

RULE III. GENETIC TESTING

Current rule III. (d) All hair samples for testing are to be submitted to the Australian Equine Genetics Research Laboratory (AERGC) or any other organization that the PHAA designates.

Amended rule III. (d) All hair samples for testing are to be submitted to the Australian Equine Genetics Research Centre (AEGRC) through the PHAA or any other organization that the PHAA designates. Any sample submitted for DNA testing to the PHAA and subsequently the AEGRC and the resulting DNA profile remain the property of the PHAA.

Explanation: This change has been brought about by the AERGC who requested the clarification be made. They are responsible to the organization who requested the DNA profile not the owner of the horse from which the DNA sample was taken.

RULE 3 MEMBERSHIPS – (AGM PROPOSED MOTION RULE 3.)

Following sub paragraph (f)

Insert new heading and allocate sub paragraph numbering to existing membership types:

Types of memberships:

- (a) Life member: (as written)
- (b) Full member: (as written)
- (c) Constituent member: (as written)
- (d) Family members: (as written)
- (e) Junior youth member: (as written)(f) Senior youth member: (as written)

- Insert new (g) and (h)
- (g) Associate member: For a person who no longer own or show a Paint Horse and wish to remain associated with the PHAA or who have never owned a Paint Horse but who wish to be associated with the PHAA. Membership will entail voting privileges and a journal.
- (h) Introductory membership: For a person who has never been a member of the PHAA and is considering the purchase of or has just purchased a Paint Horse. Membership will entail all privileges of a full membership. Introductory membership is only for the initial 12 months or part thereof when first joining the PHAA after which full membership must be purchased.

(Schedule of fees will need to be amended to incorporate the changes and both Associate and Introductory memberships will be set at \$95)

The NSW Reining State Championship Show was held at Tamworth ALEC arena 8th to the 11th July - the first time in over 25 years the show has left Sydney. Another first was the number of entries, with over 400 runs over the four days and Paint Horses were very well represented.

PAINT HORSE PERFORMANCES AT THE RECENT NSW REINING STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

The first NRHA event on Wednesday afternoon was the combined class Novice Horse Open Level I and Level 2. Keiran Moses gelding "Pain in the Glass" (Whizzel a Melody imp x Shoot I'm Cute) ridden by Cameron Halliwell ran a very credible 67.5 to place 5th in the event.

In the Novice Horse Non Pro Level I Rod Show riding "Great Guns" (Son of a Gun imp x Spinatinky) ran a 68 to place 3rd. He also ran equal 3rd in the Level 2. These classes had 28 entries. The Snaffle Bit Open was run on Thursday morning and Margaret Foord's stallion "Ace of Clubs" (Moonee Blues x Boney Lass) ridden Michael Bingham ran a respectable 66 to place 6th, there were 11 entries in this class.

That brought us to Friday evening with the running of the Futurities. What an amazing night it was! The Shiney and Nu Futurity Series was decided over six divisions, three in the Open and three in the Non Pro. The winner of the Open Futurity, with a score of 142pts was Cameron Halliwell riding his great little colt 'Gottagetagunner' (Gunner (USA) x Jessies Red Caddie), a horse Cameron owns with his partner Keiran Moses. Even though this colt is only AQHA registered I thought it was worth a mention that he is by the great APHA and AQHA reining sire "Gunner".

Belinda Coleman's beautiful black and white mare "Special Guns" (Son of a Gun imp x Sheza Stylish Chic) ridden by Graham Cooper were there to defend their Victorian Futurity title and ran a 138 to place 4th in the Open division. Graham was very pleased with "Special's effort" given that the ground did not suit her. The pair went on to receive the Reserve Champion in the Intermediate Division behind Cameron.

The Non Pro Futurities were also hotly contested. Again Cameron Halliwell and "Gottagetagunner" took out the Open Division with Rod Shaw on his mare "Gunner Play" (Son of a Gun imp x Georgia Roy) running equal Reserve Champion on a score of 133.5. In a very exciting finish to the Intermediate Non Pro Futurity we had a tie with Rod Shaw and 'Gunner Play' and Peter Bartolo aboard 'Battlers Legend' tied for the lead after both producing 133.5pt runs. After a drag we had a very close run-off with Rod emerging the winner with a strong 138pt run. The final class in the Shiney and Nu Futurity Series was the Limited Non Pro Futurity and again the winner was Rod Shaw on 'Gunner Play'.

The feature of the show this year were the Derbies on Saturday night. Again both Open and Non Pro were divided in the three sections. The Non Pro Derby was won by Cameron Halliwell aboard Keiran Moses' "Pain In The Glass" with a fabulous 140pt run. Equal 3rd was Rod Shaw on "Great Guns" with a score of 136.5. Rod and "Great Guns" were also awarded Co-Reserve Champions in the Intermediate and Co-Reserve Champions in the Limited division. The Derby had 22 entries.

I have to say a big thank you to Stephan Mowbray for the use of his wonderful photos. Note: the divisions and levels are determined by the earnings of the riders.

It's been an exciting year for the PHAA and I'd like to congratulate those members who are out competing in the non-traditional fields. It's great to go to a Dressage day or Pony Club Gymkhana or a Campdraft and watch Paint Horses compete and win against the best of the more traditionally used breeds. Paint Horses are now up there with the best of the QH's in Reining events and as per Gail Shaw's report on the NSW Reining Horse Championships, the Paints that competed did extremely

well. There are members competing at Team Penning, Ranch Sorting as well as Rodeo events and of course Barrel Racing. Each year, as the National Day of the Cowboy approaches, members of the Board of Directors for the National Day of the Cowboy organisation have the privilege of reviewing the many nominations submitted for its annual Cowboy Keeper Awards[®]. It is always an uplifting experience. The award is bestowed upon those who make a significant contribution to the preservation of cowboy culture and pioneer heritage. This year there were more nominations than ever, each one raising the bar for future nominees. Those selected to receive the award share, among other things, an impeccable character, a joyful work ethic, a broad range of talents and skills, a love for educating the public about cowboys, a sense of leadership and a high degree of creativity. We are proud to name Sheila Carson,Waddie Mitchell, Ernie Sites, David Stoecklein, Bud Young, and husband wife team, Lyman & Alaire Tenney, as our 2015 Cowboy Keeper Award recipients.

Alaire & Lyman Tenney


Lyman "C" Tenney, was born one of ten children on his family's cattle ranch near Willcox, Arizona. His wife, Alaire, born in El Paso, Texas, was the daughter of Quarter Horse Association founder and QHA Hall of Fame inductee, J.E. Browning. Together, Lyman and Alaire left a deep cowboy mark on the American Southwest and Australia.

Lyman started cowboying as soon as he could climb on a horse and spent 60 years in the saddle. At 15 he left home to cowboy on his own. "I wanted to see all the ranches I could and work for 'em all." In Arizona, he worked ranches from Big Chino to Ashfork, all the ranches on the Verde to Clarkdale, Cottonwood to Flagstaff, Mingus Mountain to Orme Ranch, Camp Verde to Dewey, Prescott to Crown King, down the Hassayampa and up Yarnell to Wickenburg. He worked cattle from Skull Valley to Williamson Valley,

Cochise, Santa Cruz, and Pima Counties, the Graham, Winchester and Galiuros Mountains, the slopes of the Rincons, Whetstones, Huachucas, and more. He was a rodeo cowboy in the US, Australia and Tasmania, in Saddle Bronc, Bareback and Bull Riding, and the timed events of Steer Roping, Calf Roping and Team Roping and a contestant at the Prescott Rodeo for 22 years straight. During July 4th weekend, in 1941, he drove to Prescott to enter the Rodeo. There he met 18 year-old cowgirl, Alaire Browning. The next summer, they decided to marry, and wed the day after he won the Dewey Saddle Bronc money. Lyman went to work on the DK then the DuBois Ranch, until Alaire's father bought the Bar HL south of Willcox. They worked the Bar HL from 1942 to 1951 when they bought the Muleshoe Ranch, selling it when drought forced them out. They moved to California, running 6,500 head of cattle in Imperial Valley. In 1963, Alaire, who was an expert cowhand, was badly injured when her horse tripped in a hole and rolled on her. She was unconscious for 77 hours. Recovery took far longer as she had to learn to walk again.

In 1966, AI Stansbury asked the Tenneys to run his ranch in Australia's Northern Territory. Their accomplishments in Australia alone could fill volumes. On the Woollogorang "Station," in Australia, they managed the largest cattle operation they had ever run -2,225 square miles, 1,650,000 acres, 10,000 head of cattle. It was 500 miles to the nearest grocery store and the closest rail point. Cattle drives to the railhead took 11 weeks. Lyman soon arranged to haul cattle by semi, shortening the drive to 18 days.

One day, Lyman and son, Todd, gave a Team Roping demonstration at the Mount Isa Rodeo. It soon became a popular and widespread Rodeo event. Lyman has since been called the "Father of Australian Team Roping," because he introduced it to the continent. Lyman



and Alaire took part in an experimental program for Nelson Hunt, to domesticate water buffalo. Lyman helped form the CeeTeeGee Saddle Tree Company, making saddle trees for American-style roping saddles and hornless bronc riding saddles. They staged the first roping school in Australia and helped establish the first Rodeo Club, started the Western Performance Horse Club and the Sierra Bonita Roping Club, trained Quarter Horses and taught western riding. In Aspley, they helped establish the Pine View Equestrian Centre, became involved with the Australian Trail Horse Riders Association and helped establish the Australian National Riding Trail, said to be the longest continuous horse trail in the world.

They gave Seminars and Clinics teaching American style horsemanship and horse training, Cutting and Reining, as well as Rodeo riding skills. Within a decade, they held over 100 schools in Australia and Tasmania. They imported Quarter Horses, Appaloosas and Paints from the U.S. Lyman helped organise regional QHAs, and was a founding member of the Australian Quarter Mile Racing Association, a charter member of the National Cutting Horse Association of Australia, and organised and brought to fruition an NCHA Finals and Futurity. Alaire in turn, started the popular Ladies Cuttings in Australia. They formed the Western Australia Cutting Club. Hethey were co-founder of the Paint Horse Association of Australia, and their Paint Horse, Joeleo, was one of the founding sires a PHAA Champion, PHAA National Champion and the first horse inducted into the Australian PHA Hall of Fame. In 1971, Lyman produced the first American style Rodeo in Brisbane. In 1973, at age 54, at the Roma Rodeo, he won 1st in Calf Roping and Team Roping and 2nd in Steer Roping, winning the All-Around Championship; the first time in Australian Rodeo it was awarded to a contestant who only roped. In 1977, they formed the Albany Trail Riders Association. In 1979, Alaire was appointed head of the National Paint Horse Queen Committee, where she organised the Queen contest for the first NPHAA National Show.

In 1980, they returned to Arizona. 1986 found them managing the 87 square mile DG Ranch outside Wickenburg. In 1994 they retired in Willcox, then moved back to Prescott. Lyman was inducted into the Arizona Living Pioneer Hall of Fame. Alaire, who ranched, roped cattle; team roped, and taught roping and riding right beside her husband, passed away in 2008. Lyman passed in 2009.

Few if any, men or women have cowboyed as extensively in the American Southwest as Lyman and Alaire Tenney, and no other husband and wife team has done more to proliferate the cowboy culture in Australia.

In 2012 I purchased a well known four year old Paint Gelding "Colourise Me" or Flash from Lynette Hall in Calliope Qld. Flash had already been shown successfully winning in all major events as a Junior Horse. When I purchased him I continued to show him at a National and State level in Amateur classes with great results. After having a successful 2014 Qld State Show I decided to give him a spell for 12 months whilst I concentrated on other horses.

During this time he was occasionally bought back in as a spare horse for a trail ride, a clinic or for my girls to have a ride. After many attempts to try and find an appropriate pony for my eldest daughter Grace (7) to ride, I agreed to let Grace ride Flash unaided at home. This magnicently natured horse took it all in his stride and trotted off down the paddock.

In July 2015 Grace attended her first Pony Club meet. Although she had the largest "Pony" in her group (Flash stands at 16hh), he confidently and very kindly attempted water jumps, cavalettis, flag racing and a cross country course. You could not wipe the smile ftom Grace's face!

As a mother I trust this horse and under all his quirks and mannerisms I could not of asked for a better "Pony Club Pony" for my children. This truly goes to show how versatile and loving our wonderful Paints can be.

The winning bidder will be responsible for making all arrangements with the stallion owner(s) regarding payments of any and all costs associated with the service, e.g. agistment, veterinary treatment, feeds, farrier, transportation, medications and drenches etc.

I advertised her a few times but most people shied away from her colour. I had a lot of people tell me she would be too high maintenance, which I can tell you is rubbish. She takes no more than any other horse to care for.



My neighbour Maddie, who is a competitive Barrel Racer was over one day helping us in the rope pen when she said she would really like to learn to Team Rope so I thought I could kill two birds with the one stone and teach Maddie to rope and she could ride Tango and start her on cattle. It was the perfect combination. With Maddie only beginning, she was forced to take Tango very slowly and this was what made this mare so cool and collected in the rope pen today. After a few months I decided I would have a ride on her and see where she was up to, I was amazed, this mare was pretty much ready to compete.

A few months later I took her to her first Jackpot where we placed 2nd and 3rd and every Jackpot after that she won money. I rode her at the Pacific Coast Shootout in Tamworth to win the Number 7s Roping, along with my heeler, Shaun Bridge. We competed against 81 other teams in the Roping that day. I am so lucky to have this mare, she is one tough cookie and she has a great future ahead of her.

Midnight Cowboy entered this world on 1st Sept. 2011, around midnight, hence the name. I work afternoon shift at Nestlé's and I arrived home at midnight and noticed the little companion pony 'Rocket' running around, so I knew our mare had foaled.

Tony was supposed to be on foal watch and he was fast asleep! I woke him up and we went out with the torch to see what 'Bubba' aka 'I've Been Hustled' had. We could see it was loudly coloured and it looked black and white. We were so excited, but it was morning before Tony confirmed it was indeed a black and white colt.

He was everything we had hoped for, a loud black and white overo colt with two blue eyes! It was love at first sight and I was so impressed with him that I wouldn't let the mare leave the property to be bred. We left her empty and I stood at the window watching him for months!

In the New Year we weaned Cowboy and prepped him for the Halter Showcase at Werribee in March. He won a belt buckle for the highest placed Paint in the Open Weanling Futurity and from there we took him to some local shows. On the 14th February disaster struck, when he stood on a nail. We gave him some antibiotics, but his foot wasn't healing then a further complication, he started to scour. We took him to the Kilmore Vets on 25th February for further tests. On the 27th of February they came out and gave him an injection directly into his joint. They did this again on the 1st March, but Cowboy still had the scours. Over the next few days the vets came out twice daily to stomach drench him, because his scours were like water.

He wasn't drinking or eating and his tail was wringing wet. On the 6th March his abscess burst, it was right in the frog on his off side hind foot. He was under constant vet care to clean his abscess and drench him. On the 13th March he was back at the vets for an overnight stay whilst they cleaned his hoof out again. His hoof was still infected and it had spread up into his bone, so he had to have a special shoe made with a plate to keep his foot clean and dry. He had no frog at this stage! We had to cover his shoe/plate with bandages and put an easy-boot on him every time we let him out.

He still had scours so the vets tried giving him codeine, which shut everything down, so he had colic for the next three days! I had the Monday off on the second day of Cowboy's colic, but I had to go into work the next day. When I was asked how my horse was going I burst into tears and they let me go home because I was a babbling mess! This was heartbreaking for both of us and this horse was going through hell, but he is one tough little fighter! On the 19th March the vets tried drenching him with manure and yoghurt, but nothing worked.

The vets had to come out every three days to take his plate off with a screwdriver and clean out his foot, re-bandage and put the easy-boot back on! On the 27th March it got re-infected so he went back to the vets for another operation-clean out. They had to scrape the infection off his bone! They asked if Midnight Cowboy was insured, but I insured him after it happened in February so he wasn't covered. I told the vets to just do their best.

I wasn't expecting him to come home, but the next day Tony picked him up, and it was back to cleaning and bandaging his foot for many more weeks! After the 27th visit by the vets, he got colic again on the 23rd May. Cowboy got over that and on the Ist June an American vet advised us to try him on charcoal powder and yoghurt twice a day for I month. We did what he said, I drenched him with it in the morning and Tony did it at night for 30 days.

He was slowly putting on weight and drinking more, but his manure was still really soft. Every time I cleaned his stable, Tony would ask, "How's his manure today"? His stable walls were covered in manure from scours!

One day in June we decided to take him to a horse show at Merricks – he got 1st and Champion! He wasn't fat but he was never really thin or showed his ribcage – he was just lean!

On the 29th July, Cowboy was off his feed again, so it was back to the vets – his scours had returned watery again. The vet told us there was nothing more they could do for him, as they had tried everything over the last five months, so we were on our own, but we never gave up. We decided to leave him outside on grass to see if natural food would help. Cowboy would put on weight, and then go backwards off and on!

On the 1st Sept 2013 it was his birthday and he reached the ripe old age of two. We started him on Bariki Horsepower (see end of article) and he seemed to start putting weight on again. We purchased two mares to breed to him and we hand-bred him



not knowing if they would get in foal, but they did. We also received one outside mare to him and she got in foal too!

We started mouthing him and on 27th November, he had his first ride by our nephew, Paul. On his fourth ride, I sat on him! After Paul had ridden him about 18 times, we sent him to be trained by Doug Hill in Tongala. After three and a half months training with Doug Hill, we took him to the NPHA in Sydney where in his first event he placed 3rd out of 14 in the NSWQHA Western Pleasure Feature! Unfortunately, he didn't make the top 10 in the 2-Year-Old NPHA Futurity. He was against 20 of the top two year olds in the country, but the next year as a three year old he made the top 10 and finished up placing 7th out of the original 18.

Cowboy placed 1st in the NPHA Halter and 1st in the HBGA Halter at SIEC. He then went on to achieve 1st in the Sires Classic Open Western Pleasure Futurity! Cowboy bred six mares last year at Doug Hill's, all A.I., and we are excited to see what he has this year! This little horse has come a long way and is now home for a rest over winter, before going back to Doug Hill's for another breeding season!

- Supreme Exhibit Sun n Surf 2013
- Supreme Exhibit RAS Werribee in 2013 and 2014
- Supreme Exhibit Garfield and 1st in the 2-Year & Over Maturity
- VPHA Xmas in July Show- Supreme Paint Exhibit
- Paul rode him in Maiden Rider Walk/Jog and placed 1st
- Paul rode him again in Maiden Horse Walk/Jog and then in the
- Open Western Pleasure and placed 1st in both.

Then Cowboy and I got dressed up as an Indian squaw riding a painted horse with 'war paint' for the fancy dress class and we placed 2nd out of 5.1 hadn't ridden a horse for about 14 years, but I felt safe on Cowboy even if he had Indian tassles flapping around his legs! I hope Midnight Cowboy, Tony and I have a brighter future and we can't wait to start promoting his foals!

Understanding Equine Digestion

When grazing, a horse feeds predominately on leaves, plant stems and buds, consuming the bulk of its feed as forage or grass. Starch from seeds does not naturally contribute a significant portion of the diet of a grazing horse. In contrast, stabled horses, especially those in upper level equestrian training, are obliged to consume low moisture (10% as fed), concentrate rations containing from 30-60% by weight of starch-based grain mixes to meet their needs for energy in a volume that they are able to consume, with minimal bulk contributed by roughages of chaff, hay and access to grazing.

The horse is able to adapt to a wide variety of feeds because of its unique digestive tract structure, with a single stomach and small intestine layout, and a ruminant-like fibre fermenting, large volume hindgut for microbial digestion, utilising feeds of lower nutrient content.

As a horse owner, it is useful to have a good basic understanding of the feeding behaviour and digestive processes to ensure optimum digestive efficiency of horse being prepared for showing or competition.

The Digestive Layout and Digestive Physiology

It is an advantage to understand the unique digestive layout and function of the horse gut to provide a basis for formulating suitable diets, feeding times and avoiding digestive upset or the poor utilisation of a ration.

THE MOUTH

The oral cavity of the horse plays a crucial role in the collection and preparation of feed prior to it entering the other digestive compartments. The horse selects its feed based on the texture, smell, taste and length of the food, such as chaff, in the feed mix. Horses have a large muzzle and pliable lips that enable careful selection of individual feeds within a mix. The horse grinds or 'minces' its food with its teeth, with the lower jaw being 33% narrower than the upper jaw, creating a grinding action as the jaw 'sweeps' from side to side during chewing. The difference in width of the lower and upper jaw teeth necessitates a 'side to side' jaw sweep to chew food, resulting in the eventual development of hard, enamel sharp outer edges on the upper molars and inside edges on the lower molars. Sharp molar edges may lead to lacerations of the soft oral cheek membranes and tongue, increasing discomfort and reducing the efficiency of chewing, and ultimately the food particle size passed on into the digestive tract.

I. The Chewing Action

Horses grind or 'mince' food into small particles of less than 1.6-2.0 mm in diameter by the repeated 'sweeping' action of the jaws, chewing each mouthful an average of 12 times, or 60-75 chews/minute over a range of feeds. However, lengths of roughage

up to 12 mm are common in the stomach in a healthy horse with good teeth. It is thought that the longer roughage acts to increase the rate of passage through the small intestine, assist in holding water in the digestive system and open up the digestive mass in the hindgut to facilitate microbial digestion and maintain optimum consistency of the droppings.

Horses are unable to regurgitate or vomit and only have one pass of their teeth to prepare food into particles small enough for enzymatic and microbial digestion. Ruminants (cattle, sheep, goats) regurgitate the food mass 3-4 times to grind it into smaller particles and mix the food 'ball' or bolus with saliva and microbes to facilitate ruminal function. Horses need to grind the food mass thoroughly prior to swallowing; otherwise their digestive efficiency is impaired.

Horses that consume or 'bolt' their food too quickly, or do not chew and grind it adequately due to sharp-edged molars or other dental abnormalities, do not grind their food into small enough particles and have less efficient digestion, often losing condition. It is estimated that up to 15% of race horses in training do not prepare their food adequately because of sharp-edges or abnormal teeth, or they eat 'sweet' feeds too quickly without chewing and salivating efficiently to ensure optimum digestion needed for them to perform and race successfully. Up to 33% of aged horses die prematurely because of poor or abnormal teeth that reduces their ability to prepare feed for digestion.

A horse chews grains and hays at a different rate as follows,

Oats Hay	800-1000 chews/kg 2000-2500 chews/kg
Sweet Feed	350-500 chews/kg – rapid consumption, reduced chewing and less buffering by saliva, possibly leading to an increased
Feed pellets and mash	risk of gastric ulcers. 400-480 chews/kg

Horses with dental abnormalities often chew more and salivate profusely.

It is important to have a horse's teeth checked for sharp-edges at the start of each season and in 2-4year olds that are losing teeth and 'caps' as they change from foal teeth to permanent teeth, the teeth should be checked and rasped every six months.

If a horse is 'bolting' its feed, I suggest that you cut a piece of heavy duty Weldmesh with 125 mm \times 125 mm boxes so that it fits snugly into the feeder and position it on top of the feed in the bin, forcing the horse to eat between the wires, reducing its ability to eat quickly or waste feed by pushing it out of the bin with its nose. There is also a significant difference in the efficiency of chewing of short chopped (preferred fine-cut or double-cut 'racehorse chaff ') and long-chopped ('rough cut') chaff mixed into the grain mix. Studies in Germany found that long chopped chaff with particles between 2-4 cm in length was more likely to be ground into smaller particles, along with the grain, with slower intake and more complete chewing, facilitating increased saliva secretion during chewing, as compared to fine-cut chaff.

2. Salivation

Horses secrete copious volumes of saliva – up to 12-14 litres/day when chewing dry feed mixes and up to 20 litres when consuming dry hay as the major roughage. Saliva has no amylase enzymatic N11 Nutrition Fact Sheet 11 Understanding Equine Digestion N11 content, but it has a high potassium and buffering bicarbonate content in its viscous, mucoid consistency which helps to provide a buffering, protective coating against gastric acid 'burn' around the 'gullet' inlet and upper non glandular stomach region. Horses that eat quickly, especially sweet feeds that do not stimulate salivation, may not salivate adequately to prepare the food for entry into the stomach, and are more likely to develop gastric ulcers in training. In fact, feeding a small amount of 50ml of acid as apple cider vinegar mixed into 100ml of water in the meal after exercise will stimulate salivation and provide additional buffering and protection to the stomach wall.

THE STOMACH

The stomach is a 'J' shaped expandable bag, with relatively small capacity, ranging from about 5-7 litres, in a Thoroughbred sized horse. It facilitates only minimal fibre and protein digestive function, with little protein degradation by gastric acid. The stomach has different rates of passage of the food mass, relative to the fibre content. Highly fibrous feeds, such a poor quality hay or chaff, are passed more quickly through the stomach as compared to denser grains and protein meals, which accumulate within the lower glandular section of the stomach. New research has highlighted some starch and sugar fermentation activity in the more alkaline area within the upper curvature of the stomach before the food mass passes into the small intestine. In this area, the passage rate is slower and the acidity approaches alkalinity (pH 7.0) to sustain microbial fermentation of starch and non-structural carbohydrates in the feed. The lower stomach compartment is lined with glandular membrane which secretes gastric acid, from 10-15 litres per day, with release on a near continuous flow, with or without food entering the stomach. In a stabled horse, the gastric pH can reach as low as pH 1.0 in the lower stomach area during fasting between feeds, which is thought to be a factor in the development of gastric ulcers when horses are exercised on an empty stomach. The upper area of the stomach wall has a nonglandular squamous cell 'skin-like' lining that has little natural acid resistance and relies on the neutral, near alkaline pH of roughage and saliva mix in the meal. Well chewed hay and chaff particles become suspended in the upper stomach section and the alkalinity of the large volumes of saliva entering with the food helps to protect it from acid attack and erosion.

I. Microbial Activity

New research suggests that microbial action in the alkaline area on the lesser curvature contributes up to 30% digestion of the non-structural carbohydrates or starches prior to the digestive mass entering the small intestine. In a grazing horse, the stomach is maintained at near full capacity, but in a stabled horse with twice a day feeds, the stomach almost empties between 12 hourly feeds, leading to a lower overall pH and almost cessation of microbial digestion between feeds due to the near continuous secretion of gastric acid from the glandular region. Studies have found that feed containing longer fibres of up to 12 mm or more in length extended the emptying time to facilitate microbial digestion. The lining of this area has been shown to be able to absorb and transport significant amounts of volatile fatty acids produced by gastric microbial activity, which can be converted to energy and muscle glycogen stores in working horses.

2. Equine Gastric Ulcer Syndrome

Gastric ulcers (EGUS) are known to result from acid attack of the non-glandular epithelium lining of the upper stomach wall and around the sensitive 'gullet 'inlet, particularly when a horse is exercised or travelled on an empty stomach prior to feeding. A quarter of a biscuit of dampened lucerne hay or 500 grams (4 litres) of lucerne chaff given 30 minutes before exercise has been found in two studies to reduce the risk of EGUS by 50% in horses in training. Lucerne contains natural calcium and magnesium buffers, mucilage and soap-like compounds to help protect the upper gastric lining and stimulates chewing and saliva secretion more effectively than grass or cereal hays or chaffs.

THE SMALL INTESTINE

The small intestine is between 21-25 metres in length (cattle have a 40 metre long SI) with a volume of 40-50 litres. The transit speed of the food mass is around 30cms/minute, with faster passage time for fibrous foods, such as hay, chaff and laxative, green grass. The pH of the small intestine ranges from 7-8.5 being highest in the last section of the small intestine where it secretes large quantities of bicarbonate to maintain active pre-caecal microbial fermentation. The alkalinity of the small intestine helps promote and maintain active enzyme digestion and transport of sugars, amino acids, fats and other nutrients through the wall.

I.Starch and Fat Digestion

Ideally 50-70% of the starch and non-structural carbohydrates are digested by pancreatic amylase, brush border disaccharides and limited microbial digestive activity. Studies indicate that there is little amylase activity in a non-grain fed horse, although increased activity of amylase, proteinases and lipases can be conditioned by feeding concentrate starch, protein and fat containing feeds. Fat digestion by lipases can increase over a 2-4 week by a step-wise introduction of vegetable oil as an energy source in the diet of working horses. Overflow of excess starch and non-structural carbohydrates into the hindgut can be a problem when horses are 'grained up' with high starch grains, such oats and corn, too quickly in training. Overload of undigested sugars into the hindgut can lead to an increase in lactic acid producing microbial activity, with a lowering of hindgut pH and low grade laminitis, seen as 'rings' on the hooves and foot soreness and a 'scratchy' gait in horses on high grain feeds. In a survey in the USA in the early 1990's, it was found that 46% of racehorses in training on 5kg or more of grain had signs of low-grade laminitis and reduced performance caused by foot soreness. In another study, it was found that feeding more than twice the volume of chaff relative to grain in a working horse's ration, reduced the efficiency of digestion of starch to energy in the small intestine, presumably due a 'smothering' effect of the excess chaff or fibre passing with the grain through the small intestine. More undigested starch was passed into the hindgut which in turn, increased the risk of low-grade laminitis. Horses that consumed their food too quickly also had a higher risk of passing undigested grain into the hindgut and subsequent upset and laminitis.

2. Protein Digestion Protein

digestion to amino acids by enzymes is highest in the in the alkaline environment of the lower small intestine, with some microbial attack in the upper and central sections of the small bowel. Microbial and excess dietary proteins are not significantly absorbed from the large intestine to meet amino acid needs. Horses therefore require a dietary source of good quality protein (balanced and adequate in essential amino acids) to meet their daily protein needs from small intestinal degradation of food proteins to amino acids. In contrast, cattle can utilise ruminal microbial protein as a source of protein when fed poor quality roughages.

3. Mineral Digestion

Calcium is the primary mineral absorbed (90%) from the small intestine, with its absorption facilitated by acid salts, phosphorus and Vitamin D. Other minerals, such as magnesium, sodium, potassium and chloride are well absorbed from the small intestine, and 50% or more of uptake of major trace-minerals occurs from the small intestine, with 90% of the phosphorus uptake from the hindgut. Excess calcium in the feed mix, especially supplementary mineral calcium as limestone or dolomite, can reduce the uptake of magnesium, manganese, zinc and iron from the feed mix. Contrary to popular belief, dolomite is poorly absorbed from the small intestine of horses and contributes very little calcium and magnesium to correct low or inadequate levels of these important bone minerals in the feed. Dicalcium phosphate or DCP (23% calcium and 18% phosphorus with a 75% uptake) is the most efficiently absorbed commonly available calcium source for horses.


LARGE INTESTINE

The large intestine is equivalent to the rumen (paunch) of a ruminant, as it facilitates microbial fermentation of cellulose to volatile fatty acids and limited amounts of methane. The methane produced is metabolized by other microbes and horses do not pass methane in their droppings, reducing this major contribution to one of the most dangerous green-house gasses which is belched out by ruminating cattle, sheep, goats (as well as camels and alpacas) as ruminants. Excess protein entering the large intestine is fermented to heat, with up to 6 times more 'heat waste' than excess starches and fibre fermentation. The 'blind sac', or caecum, in the right flank area (1.2 metres long and 25-30 litres in volume), commences the microbial fermentation of fibre to volatile fatty acids and residues of proteins and starches overloaded from the small intestine.

The remaining large colon (3-3.7 metres in length or 50-60 litres) in volume accounts for 34% (about one third) of the total digestive tract volume. The food mass moves through at 2-3cm/minute, being mixed by a sophisticated system of retrograde flow and intestinal motility to facilitate microbial attack. The large colon is the primary site of microbial fermentative gas production, which can rapidly increase when a horse is provided with highly fermentable carbohydrate feeds and excess sugars. The primary secretion and uptake of water is from the large colon.

The small colon (3-3.2 metres) and rectum (0.3 metres) dry out the faecal mass as an important part of final water reclamation in maintaining hydration in the exercising horse.

Around 50% of the dry matter content of the droppings of a horse consists of viable, fermenting microbial cells passed out in the waste because they are not used as a source of protein and other nutrients by the horse. Damp horse droppings continue to ferment after being passed for up to 10 days.

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On the 11th April 2008 a chestnut tobiano colt was born in Columbus Grove, Ohio USA. This baby colt was the result of a careful breeding program by Vanessa Anderson ... the mating of her successful performance tobiano mare to an outstanding Quarter Horse stallion.

The colts sire, "One Hot Krymsun", was a three times World Champion and four times Congress Champion. He is rated number two Leading Sire in Open Performance and number three Amateur Performance Worldwide.

The colt's dam, "Kissed With Class", was just short of her Superior Western Pleasure when injury saw her career end at an early age. The colt was her first foal.

On the 13th of November 2009, ONE KOOL KISSER'S American registration was transferred into my name and this was the beginning of a whole new chapter in our breeding program here at TALLY STATION Show and Investment Horses.

John and I could see the need in Australia for a tobiano colt from a family of well performed horses. We wanted to address the problem of breeding overo to overo and the heartache it can be for people whose mare produced a Lethal White foal. ONE KOOL KISSER can never produce a Lethal White foal, so combined with his strong family tree; he was to us, the perfect choice to compliment overo mares as well as QH in Australia.

Vanessa Anderson had a huge regard for trainers, Tim and Shannon Gillespie, so I took her advise and sent ONE KOOL KISSER to them to start. He had several months with the Gillespie's then based in Dayton Ohio. I had the opportunity to visit "Romeo", as he was affectionately known, at the Gillespie's barn in February 2010. It was such a pleasure to see this lovely young colt in the flesh and to get to know him and see first hand his

hand his presence, self-carriage, natural talent and his kind manner.

He was to be the Gillespie's pick for the 2year-old classes at the PHAA World Show in November that year, but due to our huge costs associated with transportation etc

to Australia, we had to cut short the hope of him being shown in the USA.We went ahead and arranged travel for him to Australia in time for our 2010 breeding season.

> ONE KOOL KISSER stood his first breeding season here at Tally Station to a very limited book and just six of our own mares, including our imported Quarter Horse girls, Perflection and Hey Did You know. I will go into detail about the resulting foals further on in this article.

Under the guidance of the team at Rockin Horse Ranch, 2011 saw ONE KOOL KISSER shown for the first time to become a Multiple PHAA National Champion. His Hunter Under Saddle Class, with Carolyn Johnson riding, was such a beautiful run that it had the ALEC arena in complete silence! Kane Skopp took out the honours in his Western Pleasure Class as well as Halter. It was an honour for me to speak later with one of the Judges. His comments took off some of the "sting" by not giving him the chance in the USA by saying, "ONE KOOL KISSER would be right at the top of the line showing in the USA and will be a huge asset to Australia".

Carolyn again rode him to NPHA Reserve Futurity HUS Champion and Samantha Daley took up the reins at the QLD State Paint Championships later that year again with very impressive results.

Now ... back to his foals. From his first foal crop as two year olds we saw:

TALLY S Dontalkjustkiss: 2014 Multiple National and State Champion and NPHA Champion. He was awarded 2013-2014 PHAA High Point 2-Year-Old HUS and Reserve High Point Western Pleasure. Owned by Ellen Meagher, he was trained and shown by Emma and Andrew Woinarski from Image Performance Horses. His dam is our lovely JBarC Judgement Day.

TALLY S One Happy Kamper: 2014 Multiple Reserve National Champion, State Champion and highest place PHAA in the 2-Year-Old HUS Futurity at the NPHA. He placed behind Tally S Dontalkjustkiss to be awarded PHAA Reserve High Point HUS. He was trained and shown by Kylie Copeman and Lindsay Davison of Reflection Park and later went into the barn of Image Performance Horses. His dam is our imported Quarter Horse mare, Perflection.Tally S One Happy Kamper is my pride and joy and has been retained as our Junior Sire. We eagerly await four foals by him due early this season.

Hey Kool Kisser: Another 2014 Multiple State and National Champion who was shown for major wins as a 2-year-old. 2015 saw him take out the PHAA National Championships 3-Year-Old Horsemanship and he was 3rd in 3-Year-Old Western Pleasure and the 3-Year-Old HUS Futurity. Owned by Kelly Thomas, he is leased and shown by Karman Paints. He is out of another grand imported mare - Hey Did You Know.

The next generations of ONE KOOL KISSER kids to be shown included:

Tempted To Kiss Er: 2013-2014 Top 3 PHAA High Point Yearling Lunge Line. Owned by Bernie Davey at that time and shown by Audrey Hayward. She has been very successful at both the 2014 and 2015 PHAA Nationals. This lovely filly is now owned and shown by Amateur competitor, Briohny Munn.

Ablazing Hot Kisser: As a weanling went Grand Champion at his first show and Reserve in the Futurities at the Tasmanian PHAA State for his owner, Michelle Smith.

TALLY S Da Vinci owned by Pam Eglington and **Tally S Just Alittle Kiss** owned by Michaela Breen have both shown to Champion Titles in the State of Western Australia. TALLY S Cmon N Kiss Me ... One Quick Kiss ... Aintree One Kool Kisser ... Tally S Kool Exposure ... RMB Pash ... MF Kill For A Kiss ... MF Kiss Me ... all successful for their Amateur Owners.

At the 2015 Major Shows:

YB Seeking A Kiss: PHAA National Champion 2-Year-Old Western Pleasure, as well as 2-Year-Old Champion Western Pleasure Futurity. Currently 2014- 2015 PHAA High Point 2-Year-Old Western Pleasure - proudly owned by Ann Bland and trained by Phillip Henderson of Whats New Performance Horses.


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2015 NSW PAINT HORSE Championship Show



– PROFILE – "CUITIN' TO KILL"

aka Dallas PHAA reg no. 5264

Dallas was purchased by us in 2002, when he was about four years old. We swapped him for a barrel racing saddle I had that didn't fit me and we received some money also. He had been sitting in a paddock in Bacchus Marsh with broodmares for some time after he had been purchased from a stud in Qld. His feet were in poor condition, but Tony shod him and I started him immediately. He couldn't handle much work to begin with because of his feet, but he picked up things really quickly and soon I was able to get him out and about to get him used to things.

Originally I was going to have him as a Breakaway horse and I did start Roping off him at home, and he was a gun in this event and had a nice deep stop. However, Tony fell in love with him and because he was so trainable and Tony needed a Steer Wrestling horse that ended up being his career. I seasoned him at Rodeos pushing off stock and going in the grand entry to keep his head calm and then Tony eventually started Steer Wrestling off him at Rodeos. In the beginning he could be a bit highly strung at Rodeos with the loud music and crowds when Tony was continually Steer Wrestling off him, but eventually he seasoned nicely. Tony won a number of Victorian Steer Wrestling buckles on him and went on to win the 2007 Australian Steer Wrestling Rookie title.

I also gave lessons to children on him at home and also Barrel Raced him at 3D Barrel Races for a couple of seasons. We mounted out a number of Junior competitors at Rodeos in the Junior Barrel Race when asked and also young people that wanted to Steer Wrestle that wanted to get on a good horse. Dallas is super quiet in the box, never ever messed up or got upset and always leaves the box hard and gives 110% every run.

He is now 17 years old and still going strong and Tony still Steer Wrestles off him. We haze off him on occasions too. To keep him in top shape Dallas is given the best of foods and not overly worked to keep him keen. He isn't ridden too much, pretty much ponied during the season, and ridden once or twice a week to keep him soft and a couple of runs a few times in a month during rodeo season if required. Dallas is a super-friendly horse, always talks and loves people and really enjoys hugs, laughter and being with his horse mates. Julie Breed

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
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
